A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE INSPECTORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that support for the 2 biosecurity program under the department of agriculture is
- 3 important because of the impact of invasive species to Hawaii's
- 4 agriculture, environment, natural resources, public health, and
- 5 economy. The legislature also finds that the U.S. Department of
- 6 Agriculture and other states' departments of agriculture also
- 7 face shortages in agriculture inspectors. Therefore, to improve
- 8 the effectiveness of the biosecurity program, the legislature
- 9 finds that providing the state department of agriculture with
- 10 the authority to establish, maintain, and enforce compliance
- 11 agreements with federal or other state departments of
- 12 agriculture will allow the federal and other state departments
- 13 of agriculture and their respective inspectors to work
- 14 cooperatively with Hawaii's agriculture inspectors on import and
- 15 export programs.
- 16 The importation of christmas trees is considered a high-
- 17 risk for invasive species introduction into the State. This
- 18 measure would allow the Hawaii department of agriculture to



- 1 enter into compliance agreements with the Oregon department of
- 2 agriculture and Washington department of agriculture to monitor
- 3 the growing and packing of christmas trees to reduce the amount
- 4 of invasive species that may hitchhike with shipments.
- 5 For export, our fruits industry, valued at \$30,000,000;
- 6 vegetable industry, valued at \$75,000,000; and floral and
- 7 nursery industry, valued at \$100,000,000 are at risk of losing
- 8 export markets due to quarantine measures imposed by the federal
- 9 government and other states. To assist the agricultural
- 10 industry, the legislature recommends that the Hawaii department
- 11 of agriculture enter into compliance agreements with receiving
- 12 states to establish origin-inspection programs to ease
- 13 quarantine restrictions placed on our growers.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to provide the department of
- 15 agriculture with authority to establish, maintain, and enforce
- 16 compliance agreements with federal or state departments of
- 17 agriculture, and to assess fees for conducting inspections
- 18 required under compliance agreements.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 141-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:

- 1 "S141-2 Rules. Subject to chapter 91, the department of
- 2 agriculture shall adopt, amend, and repeal rules not
- 3 inconsistent with law, for and concerning:
- 4 (1) The introduction, transportation, and propagation of trees, shrubs, herbs, and other plants;
- 6 (2) The quarantine, inspection, fumigation, disinfection, 7 destruction, or exclusion, either upon introduction 8 into the State, or at any time or place within the State, of any nursery-stock, tree, shrub, herb, vine, 9 10 cut-flower, cutting, graft, scion, bud, seed, leaf, 11 root, or rhizome; any nut, fruit, or vegetable; any 12 grain, cereal, or legume in the natural or raw state; 13 any moss, hay, straw, dry-grass, or other forage; any 14 unmanufactured log, limb, or timber; or any other 15 plant growth or plant product unprocessed or in the 16 raw state; any sand, soil, or earth; any live bird, **17** reptile, insect, or other animal, in any stage of 18 development, that is in addition to the so-called 19 domestic animals, which are provided for in section 20 142-2; and any box, barrel, crate, or other containers in which the articles, substances, or objects have 21 22 been transported or contained, and any packing

1		material used in connection therewith, that is or may
2		be diseased or infested with insects or likely to
3		assist in the transmission or dissemination of any
4		insect or plant disease injurious, harmful, or
5		detrimental, or likely to become injurious, harmful,
6		or detrimental to the agricultural or horticultural
7		industries or the forests of the State, or that is or
8		may be in itself injurious, harmful, or detrimental to
9		the same [+]; provided that included therein may be
10		rules governing the transportation of any of the
11		articles, substances, or objects enumerated above in
12		this section between different localities on any one
13		of the islands within the State[+];
14	<u>(3)</u>	The establishment, maintenance, and enforcement of
15		compliance agreements with federal or state
16		departments of agriculture authorizing agriculture
17		inspectors from the state of origin to monitor the
18		growing and packing of commodities, any treatment
19		procedures to insure compliance to quarantine laws,
20		and the assessment of fees for conducting inspections
21		required under the compliance agreement;

1	[(3)]	(4) The prohibition of importation into the State,
2		from any or all foreign countries or from other parts
3		of the United States, or the shipment from one island
4		within the State to another island therein, or the
5		transportation from one part or locality of any island
6		to another part or locality of the same island, of any
7		specific article, substance, or object or class of
8		articles, substances, or objects, among those
9		enumerated above in this section, that is diseased or
10		infested with insects or likely to assist in the
11		transmission or dissemination of any insect or plant
12		disease injurious, harmful, or detrimental or likely
13		to be injurious, harmful, or detrimental to the
14		agricultural or horticultural industries, or the
15		forests of the State, or that is or may be in itself
16		injurious, harmful, or detrimental to the same;
17	[(4)]	(5) The preparation by cargo carriers of manifests of
18		cargo transported into the State or between islands of
19		the State and the submission of the manifests to the
20		department; and
21	[(5)]	(6) The manner in which agricultural product
22		promotion and research activities may be undertaken,

after coordinating with the agribusiness development corporation.

All rules adopted under this section shall have the force and effect of law."

SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
