A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PRETAX TRANSPORTATION BENEFIT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 human resources development currently operates a pretax 3 transportation benefit pilot program in the city and county of Honolulu for any employee of the state government who: 4 5 Is an employee of the State executive branch (1)6 (excluding the department of education) who is eligible to participate in the State of Hawaii 8 employees' retirement system; 9 (2) Lives and works on Oahu; and 10 (3) Does not have parking in a state-controlled lot with a 11 parking payroll deduction. 12 The pilot program is operated under the State's qualified 13 transportation fringe benefit plan, in accordance with section 14 132(f) of the Internal Revenue Code, and authorized under the 15 federal Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century for 16 eligible State of Hawaii executive branch employees. This means **17** that eligible employees may purchase public bus passes, Handi-18 Van fare coupons, and vouchers for the cost of their vanpool

- 1 Hawaii seat fares through payroll deductions before federal,
- 2 State, and Federal Insurance Contributions Act taxes are
- 3 withheld, thereby increasing their take-home pay. In other
- 4 words, an eligible employee on Oahu may authorize the State to
- 5 have the employee's bus pass expense, the cost of a preset
- 6 amount of Handi-Van fare coupons, or vanpool Hawaii seat fees
- 7 deducted from the employee's paycheck on a pretax basis. The
- 8 State, as employer, will purchase bus passes, Handi-Van fare
- 9 coupons, or vouchers redeemable with vanpool Hawaii to cover
- 10 seat fees for eligible employees and distribute them to eligible
- 11 employees on a monthly basis. As of June 2008, the enrollment
- 12 for senior and disability annual bus passes was also included in
- 13 the pilot program.
- 14 The duration of the pilot program is determined by the
- 15 director of human resources development, and as of 2008, the
- 16 maximum allowance per month for combined commuter highway
- 17 vehicle transportation and transit pass expenses was \$115.
- 18 The savings for each employee will vary depending on the
- 19 employee's tax bracket. For example, based on an annual salary
- 20 of \$24,000, a tax savings of \$138.24, \$253.68, or \$181.53 can be
- 21 gained through participation in the pilot transportation benefit

- 1 plan for eligible employees who buy bus passes, ride the Handi-
- 2 Van, or carpool via vanpool Hawaii, respectively.
- 3 The legislature finds that the pilot program has been
- 4 successful.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to require the director of human
- 6 resources development to make the program permanent and to
- 7 expand the pilot program to all islands having a public transit
- 8 system and to employees of the legislature residing in counties
- 9 having a population of over five hundred thousand persons.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 78, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 11 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 "S78- Pretax transportation benefit program; statewide;
- 14 reports. (a) The director of human resources development shall
- 15 adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 to operate a pretax
- 16 transportation benefit program on all islands that have a public
- 17 transit system and for employees of the legislature residing in
- 18 counties having a population of over five hundred thousand
- 19 persons.
- 20 (b) No later than December 31, 2012, the director of human
- 21 resources development shall submit an interim report to the
- 22 legislature detailing the department's progress in implementing

- 1 subsection (a). No later than December 31 of each year
- 2 thereafter, the director of human resources development shall
- 3 report its findings and recommendations to the legislature
- 4 regarding the operation of the pretax transportation benefit
- 5 program for eligible employees."
- 6 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
