## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL LICENSING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 436B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to read as follows:
3	"§436B- Licensure; acceptance of military education,
4	training, or service. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary,
5	every licensing authority subject to this chapter, upon
6	presentation of satisfactory evidence by an applicant, shall
7	consider relevant education, training, or service completed by
8	an individual as a member of the armed forces or reserves of the
9	United States, the national guard of any state, the military
10	reserves of any state, or the navy militia of any state as part
11	of the evaluation process toward the qualification requirements
12	to receive the license. Evidence presented for consideration
13	for fulfillment or partial fulfillment of licensing requirements
14	shall demonstrate substantial equivalency to state standards."
15	SECTION 2. The licensing administrator of the professional
16	and vocational licensing division of the department of commerce
17	and consumer affairs shall communicate the intent and parameters
18	of this Act to each licensing authority and shall submit a

- 4 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012, and
- 6 shall be repealed on June 30, 2022.

## Report Title:

Professional and Vocational Licensing; Military Education, Training, and Service

## Description:

Requires professional and vocational licensing boards to consider relevant military education, training, and service as part of the evaluation process toward the qualifications of a license. Requires the licensing administrator of the professional and vocational licensing division of the department of commerce and consumer affairs to communicate the intent of this Act to each licensing authority and report to the legislature. Repeals June 30, 2022. (SD1)

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
