A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 27-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 3 "(b) There is established an information technology steering committee to assist the chief information officer in 4 5 developing the State's information technology standards and policies, including but not limited to: 6 7 Assisting the chief information officer in developing 8 and implementing the state information technology 9 strategic plans; 10 (2) Assessing executive branch departments' progress in 11 meeting the objectives defined in the state 12 information technology strategic plans and identifying 13 best practices for shared or consolidated services; 14 (3) Ensuring technology projects are selected based on 15 their potential impact and risk to the State, as well 16 as their strategic value;

2		sufficient tools to assess the value and benefits of
3		technology initiatives;
4	(5)	Assisting the chief information officer in developing
5		state information technology standards and policies;

7	(6)	Clarifying the roles, responsibilities, and authority

9		division, specifically as it relates to its statewide
10		duties.
11	The [members of the] information technology steering	
12	committee shall consist of thirteen members, with four members	
13	to be [appointed in equal number] selected by the senate	
14	president [and], four members to be selected by the speaker of	
15	the house of representatives, [respectively,] and four members	
16	to be selected by the chief information officer, and shall	
17	include representatives from executive branch departments,	
18	including large user agencies such as the department of	
19	education and the University of Hawaii; the judiciary; the	
20	legislature; and private individuals. The chief information	
21	officer shall serve as the chair of the committee and shall	
22	ensure that the committee is evaluated periodically."
