A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE VACANCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that an individual state

 does not have "the power to add or alter the requirements

 enumerated in the Qualifications Clause" of the United States

 Constitution. Schaefer v. Townsend, 215 F.3d 1031, 1039 (9th
- 5 Cir. 2000). Specifically a state does not have the power to
- 6 impose a residency requirement prior to the time imposed by the
- 7 United States Constitution. Id at 1038.
- 8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to conform the
- 9 State's process of appointing persons to fill vacancies in the
- 10 office of United States senator with the qualifications set
- 11 forth in the United States Constitution by removing the
- 12 residency requirement for an appointee to fill a vacancy in the
- 13 office of United States senator.
- 14 Additionally, this Act also removes the requirement that an
- 15 appointee to fill a vacancy in the office of United States
- 16 senator be a member of the same political party as the prior
- 17 incumbent for a period of at least six months immediately prior
- 18 to the appointment.

         SECTION 2. Section 17-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

    amended to read as follows:

         "$17-1 United States senator. When a vacancy occurs in
 4
    the office of United States senator, the vacancy shall be filled
 5
    for the unexpired term at the following state general election;

    provided that the vacancy occurs not later than 4:30 p.m. on the

    sixtieth day prior to the primary for nominating candidates to

    be voted for at the election; otherwise at the state general

    election next following. The chief election officer shall issue

    a proclamation designating the election for filling the vacancy.

    Pending the election, the governor shall make a temporary

- 3 All candidates for the unexpired term shall be nominated and
- 4 elected in accordance with this title."

- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
