A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§291C- Mobile electronic devices; prohibitions. (a)
5	No person shall operate a motor vehicle while using a mobile
6	electronic device.
7	(b) The use of a mobile electronic device for the sole
8	purpose of making a "911" emergency communication shall be an
9	affirmative defense to this section.
10	(c) The following persons shall be exempt from the
11	provisions of subsection (a):
12	(1) Emergency responders using a mobile electronic device
13	while in the performance and scope of their official
14	<u>duties;</u>
15	(2) Drivers using two-way radios while in the performance
16	and scope of their work-related duties and who are
17	operating fleet vehicles; and

1	<u>(3)</u>	Drivers holding a valid amateur radio operator license
2		issued by the Federal Communications Commission and
3		using a half-duplex two-way radio.
4	<u>(đ)</u>	Every person who violates this section shall be
5	subject t	o the following:
6	(1)	For a first infraction, or any infraction not preceded
7		within one year by a prior violation of this section,
8		a fine of at least \$100 but less than \$200;
9	(2)	For an infraction that occurs within one year of a
10		prior violation of this section, a fine of at least
11		\$200 but less than \$300 and the suspension of the
12	•	person's driver's license and privilege to operate a
13		vehicle for a period of thirty days; and
14	(3)	For an infraction that occurs within two years of two
15		prior violations of this section, and for the fourth
16		and each additional violation of this section,
17		regardless of when the violation occurred, a fine of
18		at least \$300 but less than or equal to \$500 and the
19		suspension of the person's driver's license and
20		privilege to operate a vehicle for a period of ninety
21		days.
22	(e)	As used in this section:

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1	"Emergency responders" means any firefighters, emergency			
2	medical technicians, mobile intensive care technicians, civil			
3	defense workers, police officers, and federal and state law			
4	enforcement officers.			
5	"Fleet Vehicle" means any vehicle validly registered			
6	pursuant to section 286-53.5.			
7	"Mobile electronic device" means any handheld or other			
8	portable electronic equipment recognized by the citing officer			
9	or other witness to be capable of providing:			
10	(1) Wireless audio, video, or data communication between			
11	two or more persons; or			
12	(2) Amusement, including a cellular phone, text messaging			
13	device, paging device, personal digital assistant,			
14	laptop computer, video game, or digital photographic			
15	<pre>device;</pre>			
16	provided that "mobile electronic device" does not include any			
17	audio equipment or any equipment installed in a motor vehicle			
18	for the purpose of providing audio, navigation, emergency			
19	assistance to the operator of the motor vehicle, or video			
20	entertainment to the passengers in the rear seats of the motor			
21	vehicle. A "two-way radio" or Private Land Mobile Radio System			
22	as defined by title 47 of the Code of Federal Regulations, part			

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- 1 90, when used for business purposes, shall not be considered to
- 2 be a "mobile electronic device".
- 3 "Operate" means to drive or assume actual physical control
- 4 of a motor vehicle upon a public way, street, road, or highway
- 5 in the State.
- 6 "Use or using" means holding a mobile electronic device
- 7 while operating a motor vehicle."
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 291C-161, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 10 "(c) Every person convicted under or found in violation of
- 11 section 291C-12, 291C-12.5, 291C-12.6, 291C-13, 291C-14, 291C-
- 12 15, 291C-16, 291C-72, 291C-73, 291C-95, 291C-102, 291C-103,
- 13 291C-104, [er] 291C-105, or 291C- shall be sentenced or fined
- 14 in accordance with those sections."
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 16 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 17 begun before its effective date.
- 18 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
