A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE IV, SECTION 2, OF THE HAWAII STATE CONSTITUTION TO ADD A RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT FOR MEMBERS APPOINTED TO THE REAPPORTIONMENT COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Article IV, section 2 of the Constitution of
- 2 the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:

3 "REAPPORTIONMENT COMMISSION

- 4 Section 2. A reapportionment commission shall be
- 5 constituted on or before May 1 of each reapportionment year and
- 6 whenever reapportionment is required by court order. The
- 7 commission shall consist of nine members. The president of the
- 8 senate and the speaker of the house of representatives shall
- 9 each select two members [-]; provided that the two members
- 10 appointed by each presiding officer shall not be residents of
- 11 the same county. Members of each house belonging to the party
- 12 or parties different from that of the president or the speaker
- 13 shall designate one of their number for each house and the two
- 14 so designated shall each select two members of the
- 15 commission[-]; provided that the two members appointed by each
- 16 of the member of the senate belonging to the party different
- 17 from that of the president and the member of the house belonging



- 1 to the party different from that of the speaker, shall not be
- 2 residents of the same county. The eight members so selected,
- 3 promptly after selection, shall be certified by the selecting
- 4 authorities to the chief election officer and within thirty days
- 5 thereafter, shall select, by a vote of six members, and promptly
- 6 certify to the chief election officer the ninth member who shall
- 7 serve as chairperson of the commission.
- 8 Each of the four officials designated above as selecting
- 9 authorities for the eight members of the commission, at the time
- 10 of the commission selections, shall also select one person from
- 11 each basic island unit to serve on an apportionment advisory
- 12 council for that island unit. The councils shall remain in
- 13 existence during the life of the commission and each shall serve
- 14 in an advisory capacity to the commission for matters affecting
- 15 its island unit.
- 16 A vacancy in the commission or a council shall be filled by
- 17 the initial selecting authority within fifteen days after the
- 18 vacancy occurs. Commission and council positions and vacancies
- 19 not filled within the times specified shall be filled promptly
- 20 thereafter by the supreme court.

- 1 The commission shall act by majority vote of its membership
- 2 and shall establish its own procedures, except as may be
- 3 provided by law.
- 4 Not more than one hundred fifty days from the date on which
- 5 its members are certified, the commission shall file with the
- 6 chief election officer a reapportionment plan for the state
- 7 legislature and a reapportionment plan for the United States
- 8 congressional districts which shall become law after publication
- 9 as provided by law. Members of the commission shall hold office
- 10 until each reapportionment plan becomes effective or until such
- 11 time as may be provided by law.
- 12 No member of the reapportionment commission or an
- 13 apportionment advisory council shall be eligible to become a
- 14 candidate for election to either house of the legislature or to
- 15 the United States House of Representatives in either of the
- 16 first two elections under any such reapportionment plan.
- 17 Commission and apportionment advisory council members shall
- 18 be compensated and reimbursed for their necessary expenses as
- 19 provided by law.
- The chief election officer shall be secretary of the
- 21 commission without vote and, under the direction of the
- 22 commission, shall furnish all necessary technical services. The



J	l legislature	shall	appropriate	funds	to	enable	the	commission	to

- 2 carry out its duties."
- 3 SECTION 2. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
- 4 be as follows:
- 5 "Shall the two members of the reapportionment commission
- 6 appointed by each of the president of the senate, speaker of
- 7 the house of representatives, the member of the senate
- 8 belonging to the opposing party of the president, and the
- 9 member of the house belonging to the opposing party of the
- speaker, be required to be residents of different counties?"
- 11 SECTION 3. Constitutional material to be repealed is
- 12 bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is
- 13 underscored.
- 14 SECTION 4. This amendment shall take effect upon
- 15 compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of
- 16 the State of Hawaii.
