A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FEED MILLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that feed accounts for up
- 2 to seventy per cent of livestock production costs. In Hawaii,
- 3 all feed is imported. High feed prices and rising
- 4 transportation costs have caused the animal agriculture industry
- 5 in Hawaii to shrink by over fifty per cent in the past ten
- 6 years.
- 7 The legislature further finds that a feed mill would
- 8 facilitate the development of local feed production to stabilize
- 9 and expand the animal agriculture industry in Hawaii. The feed
- 10 mill would verify what local products from the agricultural,
- 11 fishery, and bio-energy sectors can be used as ingredients in
- 12 feed, and showcase Hawaii as a leader in sustainable agriculture
- 13 development.
- 14 The legislature also finds that mills can only be used for
- 15 either production or experimental purposes. Consequently, all
- 16 of the mills in the western United States are used for
- 17 production and there are no experimental mills. Having an
- 18 experimental mill in Hawaii would generate income and jobs by

- 1 attracting companies from around the country to test their feed
- 2 in the State.
- 3 The legislature also finds that locally produced feed would
- 4 ensure that feed prices are controlled by internal market forces
- 5 and guarantee the supply and quality of feed for Hawaii's
- 6 livestock, resulting in the potential export of Hawaii branded
- 7 ingredients, feed, and specialty products. Locally produced
- 8 feed will also promote sustainability through the use of by-,
- 9 co-, and waste-products from other industry sectors.
- 10 The legislature finds that a feed mill would allow Hawaii
- 11 to reduce its dependence on imported feed and animal food
- 12 products, generate income, add value to other industry sectors,
- 13 create jobs, and reduce environmental waste, leading to a more
- 14 sustainable and independent Hawaii economy.
- The purpose of this Act is to award a grant to the Oceanic
- 16 Institute for the construction of the feed research and pilot
- 17 production facility.
- 18 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$450,000 or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 as a grant
- 21 pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to the Oceanic
- 22 Institute for the construction of the feeds research and pilot



- 1 production facility; provided that no funds shall be released
- 2 pursuant to this Act unless matched by private funds.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. The Oceanic Institute shall prepare a report to
- 6 the legislature on the progress of the feeds research and pilot
- 7 production facility project, including any contracts with
- 8 potential purchasers of the feed produced at the facility. The
- 9 Oceanic Institute shall submit the report to the legislature no
- 10 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
- 11 session of 2013.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
