- 14 with Medicaid liens in this chapter, an institution created for
- 15 the practice of medicine and also provides long-term care
- 16 services at a nursing facility level of care."

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this Act is to define the term "medical institution" as being an institution created for the practice of medicine and for caring for patients on a

long-term basis.

MEANS:

Amend section 346-1, Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

The term "medical institution" can be vague. This is to clarify that a medical institution is any facility that engages in the practice of medicine and also provides long-term care services at a nursing facility level of care. Section 346-29.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, allows Medicaid liens to be placed on the real property of Medicaid recipients who are in a "medical institution." A definition would help to distinguish what types of institutions would fall within the statute in order to determine whether or not a lien may be properly placed on the recipient's real property.

Impact on the public: There will be an impact on the Medicaid recipient who owns real property and becomes institutionalized in a "medical institution" because a Medicaid lien will be placed on the real property.

Impact on the department and other agencies: This amendment will assist the Department of Human Services in its collections of reimbursements for its Medicaid liens by clarifying when a lien may be placed on the real property of a Medicaid recipient who

becomes an inpatient at a "medical

institution."
