# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1  | SECTION 1. The legislature reaffirms that it is in the           |
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| 2  | general welfare of the State to protect, preserve, care for, and |
| 3  | improve the physical and mental health of Hawaii's children by   |
| 4  | making available at the public schools first aid and emergency   |
| 5  | care, preventive health care, health appraisals and follow-ups,  |
| 6  | and health room facilities. For those purposes, the department   |
| 7  | of education is authorized to establish a statewide school       |
| 8  | health services program. The purpose of this Act is to provide   |
| 9  | the department flexibility in administering and implementing the |
| 10 | health services program.   |
| 11 | SECTION 2. Section 302A-853, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is         |
| 12 | amended to read as follows:                                      |
