BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

3	SECTION 2. Section 371K-5 and Section 371K-6, Hawaii
4	Revised Statutes, are repealed.
5	["[\$371K-5] Advisory council for community services;
6	composition and compensation. (a) There is established within
7	the office of community services, the advisory council for
8	community services, herein referred to as council, except as
9.	otherwise indicated. The council shall be composed of twelve
10	members appointed by the governor subject to section 26-34,
11	except as provided in this section. Members shall have had
12	training, experience, or special knowledge concerning human
13	services programs. Of the twelve-members:
14	(1) Four members-shall be representatives of client groups
15	served by the office of community services which shall
16	include: one member from the client group previously
17	served by the progressive neighborhood program; one
18	member from the client group previously served by the
19	Hawaii office of economic opportunity; one member from
20	the client group previously served by the refugee
