A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REENTRY INTAKE SERVICE CENTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 353-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$353-10 Reentry intake service centers. There shall be within the department of public safety, a reentry intake service 4 center for adults in each of the counties, to screen, evaluate, 5 and classify the admission of persons to community correctional 6 7 centers and to provide for the successful reentry of persons back into the community. Each center shall be directed and 8 9 managed by a manager and shall be staffed by a team of 10 psychiatrists, social workers, technicians, and other personnel 11 as may be necessary. The director of public safety may appoint 12 full-time or part-time professional and clerical staff or contract for professional services to carry out the duties of 13 the centers as identified in this section. 14 The centers shall: 15 (1) Provide orientation, guidance, and technical services; 16 (2) Provide social-medical-psychiatric-psychological 17
