## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRIC GUNS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 134-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§134-16 Restriction on possession, sale, gift, or 4 delivery of electric guns. (a) It shall be unlawful for any 5 person, including a licensed manufacturer, licensed importer, or 6 licensed dealer, to possess, offer for sale, hold for sale, 7 sell, give, lend, or deliver any electric gun. 8 Any electric gun possessed, offered, held, sold, 9 given, lent, or delivered in violation of subsection (a) shall 10 be confiscated and disposed of by the chief of police. 11 (c) This section shall not apply to: 12 (1)Law enforcement officers of county police departments; **13** (2) Law enforcement officers of the department of public 14 safety; Conservation and resources enforcement officers of the 15 (3) 16 department of land and natural resources; Members of the army or air national guard when **17** (4)18 assisting civil authorities in disaster relief, civil
