# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ZIPPER LANE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Hawaii's highways are necessary to accommodate
- 2 the transportation needs of the people of the State. Increased
- 3 time spent on the road in travel decreases work efficiency, time
- 4 spent with family or at work, and quality of life. As the
- 5 population grows, especially on the west side of Oahu, the need
- 6 for travel lanes will increase.
- 7 High occupancy vehicle lanes, such as zipper lanes, reduce
- 8 the number of cars on the road by providing an incentive to
- 9 carpool. However, the zipper lane could be more effective if it
- 10 extended westward from Waipahu toward Kapolei, west of the Kunia
- 11 on-ramp.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 13 transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of
- 14 extending the zipper lane westward from Waipahu toward Kapolei,
- 15 west of the Kunia on-ramp.
- 16 SECTION 2. (a) The department of transportation shall
- 17 conduct a study on the feasibility of extending the zipper lane
- 18 westward from Waipahu toward Kapolei, west of the Kunia on-ramp

- 17 (b) The department of transportation shall submit a

  18 written report of its findings and recommendations, including

  19 any necessary proposed legislation, to the legislature no later

  20 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the state highway
- 2 fund the sum of \$200,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary
- 3 for fiscal year 2012-2013 for a study on the feasibility of
- 4 extending the zipper lane westward from Waipahu toward Kapolei,
- 5 west of the Kunia on-ramp.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 7 transportation for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.

Transportation; Zipper Lane Extension; Feasibility Study; Appropriation

## Description:

Requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a feasibility study on the extension of the zipper lane westward from Waipahu toward Kapolei, west of the Kunia on-ramp. Requires the Department of Transportation to submit a report to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2014. Appropriates \$200,000 for the study. Effective July 1, 2012. (HB2684 CD1)
