A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that public assistance
- 2 programs currently limit eligibility to those with few or no
- 3 assets. The function of asset limits is to ensure public
- resources reach individuals and families most in need. However, 4
- 5 there is growing recognition that asset limits can discourage
- 6 savings and prevent families from making investments that can
- 7 help them escape poverty. Assets, such as personal savings, are
- 8 precisely the kind of resources that allow families to move off
- 9 and stay off of public assistance programs.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 11 human services to conduct a study to evaluate current asset
- 12 limits for public assistance programs, including the temporary
- 13 assistance for needy families program, and assess the effects of
- 14 changing the asset limits on those programs.
- 15 SECTION 2. The department of human services shall conduct
- 16 a study on asset limits for public assistance programs, which
- 17 shall include:
- 18 An evaluation of current asset limits; (1)
