A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. (a) There is established in the department of
human services for administrative purposes a temporary
assistance for needy families benefits and coverage temporary
task force. The center for alternative dispute resolution shall

5 assist the temporary task force by providing a facilitator. The

6 task force shall discuss and seek input on the problems faced by

7 the State in administering the temporary assistance for needy

8 families program and possible methods that can be used to ensure

9 that temporary assistance for needy families benefits and

services are provided through public resources to properly

11 address the needs of recipients and their dependent children.

12 In addition, the task force shall research what other states are

13 doing with respect to the program that help to cover the cost of

temporary assistance for needy families benefits and develop a

15 working plan of services that temporary assistance for needy

16 families recipients may be required to perform to continue

17 receiving benefit coverage.

1	(b)	The task force shall consist of eleven members, or the
2	member's	designee, as follows:
3	(1)	A member of the house of representatives appointed by
4		the speaker of the house of representatives;
5	(2)	A member of the senate appointed by the president of
6		the senate;
7	(3)	The director of human services;
8	(4)	The administrator of the benefit, employment and
9		support services division of the department of human
10		services;
11	(5)	The administrator of the child welfare services branch
12		of the department of human services;
13	(6)	The attorney general;
14	(7)	One member selected by the benefit, employment and
15		support services division who is a recipient of
16		temporary assistance for needy families benefits; and
17	(8)	Four members appointed by the governor from a list
18		submitted jointly by the speaker of the house of
19		representatives and president of the senate, with each
20		member representing a different organization that
21		represents temporary assistance for needy families
22		recipients from each county.

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- (c) The members of the task force shall serve without
 compensation and shall receive no reimbursement for expenses.
- 3 (d) The task force shall submit a report of its findings
- 4 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
- 5 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 6 the regular session of 2013.
- 7 (e) The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2013.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
