A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROFESSIONS AND OCCUPATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Section 444-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 SECTION 1. 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 This chapter shall not apply to owners or lessees of 4 property who build or improve residential, farm, industrial, or 5 commercial buildings or structures on property for their own 6 use, or for use by their grandparents, parents, siblings, or 7 children and who do not offer the buildings or structures for 8 sale or lease; provided that: 9 To qualify for an exemption under this section, the (1)10 owner or lessee shall register for the exemption as 11 provided in section 444-9.1; and 12 (2) The exemption under this section shall not apply to 13 electrical [9x] work, plumbing work, air conditioner 14 pipefitter work, fire sprinkler technician work, or 15 solar technician work that must be performed only by 16 persons or entities licensed in accordance with this 17 chapter, unless the owner or lessee of the property is 18 licensed for such work under chapter 448E."

1 SECTION 2. Section 444-9.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: "\$444-9.5 Licensing of electrical [ex], plumbing, and 3 other trade workers. (a) At least half of all individuals 4 5 performing electrical [or] work, plumbing work, air conditioner 6 pipefitter work, fire sprinkler technician work, or solar 7 technician work employed on a construction job site by an 8 electrical [or], plumbing, air conditioner pipefitter, fire 9 sprinkler technician, or solar technician contractor shall be 10 licensed in accordance with chapter 448E. The board may waive 11 this requirement in any county when there are insufficient 12 licensed [electrical or plumbing] workers in that county to 13 comply with this section. 14 (b) All individuals employed on a construction job site by 15 an electrical [or], plumbing, air conditioner pipefitter, fire 16 sprinkler technician, or solar technician contractor who are 17 licensed in accordance with chapter 448E shall visibly display 18 their license on their person while on the construction job 19 site. Only individuals displaying their license at the time of 20 a site inspection shall be counted as a licensee to determine 21 compliance with this section."

SECTION 3. Chapter 448E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by amending the title to read as follows: 2 "ELECTRICIANS [AND], PLUMBERS, AND OTHER TRADES" 3 SECTION 4. Section 448E-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately 5 6 inserted and to read as follows: ""Air conditioning pipefitter" means any person licensed by 7 the board as an air conditioning pipefitter to perform air 8 conditioning pipefitting. 9 "Fire sprinkler technician" means any person licensed by 10 the board as a fire sprinkler technician to perform journey-11 level fire sprinkler work to install, maintain, repair, and 12 modify fire sprinkler systems. 13 "Solar technician" means any person licensed by the board 14 as a solar technician to install, test, operate, and maintain 15 solar energy systems." 16 SECTION 5. Section 448E-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended to read as follows: 18 "§448E-4 Powers and duties of board. In addition to any 19 other powers and duties authorized by law, the board shall have 20

- (8) Journey worker industrial electrician: To be eligible for the journey worker industrial electrician examination, an applicant shall be at least eighteen years of age and shall provide satisfactory evidence of experience in industrial electrical work of at least five years full-time or its equivalent, but not less than ten thousand hours;
- (9) Supervising industrial electrician: To be eligible for the supervising industrial electrician examination, an applicant shall have been registered with the board as a journey worker industrial electrician for a period of at least four years or shall have equivalent experience in the trade[-];

The board may, in addition to any 9 other remedy available, apply to a circuit court judge for a 10 temporary restraining order or preliminary or permanent 11 injunction restraining any person from acting, or assuming to 12 act, as a journey worker electrician, journey worker specialty 13 electrician, supervising electrician, supervising specialty 14 electrician, maintenance electrician, journey worker industrial 15 electrician, supervising industrial electrician, journey worker 16 plumber, [or] master plumber, air conditioning pipefitter, fire 17 sprinkler technician, or solar technician without a license 18 previously obtained in compliance with this chapter and the rules of the board, and upon hearing and for cause shown, the 19 20 judge may grant the temporary restraining order or preliminary or permanent injunction." 21
