13		shall not include visits for dialysis or chemotherapy
14		treatments covered under paragraph (1); and
15	(3)	At least eight drug prescriptions per month;
16	provided	that medical assistance shall not be provided to an
17	individua	l who receives the benefits mandated under this section

- 1 through a medical assistance program as provided under federal
- 2 law."
- 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 to provide
- 6 medical assistance to beneficiaries who are United States
- 7 citizens.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 9 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
