# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MAKAHA VALLEY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Makaha Valley is a major watershed on the
- 2 Waianae coast. Runoff from this watershed flows into streams,
- 3 which can result in flooding. Heavy rains clog the valley,
- 4 which overflows the rainwater into the surrounding area and
- 5 accumulates in the lower valley.
- 6 A devastating landslide occurred in November 1996, when
- 7 after six hours of heavy rain, two converging waterfalls sent
- 8 rocks and mud down the mountainside, overwhelming a ten-foot-
- 9 high rock retaining wall and surging through an upper level
- 10 parking lot at the Makaha Valley Tower complex, burying or
- 11 sweeping away approximately sixty cars and flooding the first
- 12 floor of the building. Officials estimated that in a two-hour
- 13 period, the storm had caused millions of gallons of water to
- 14 flow down the mountainside.
- 15 Over the years, the Makaha Valley area has experienced
- 16 flooding. More recently, in December 2008, the eighteen-hole
- 17 champion golf course in Makaha closed its seventh hole due to
- 18 flood damage.

1	The federal government will not conduct a federal flood		
2	control study for Makaha Valley because Makaha Valley does not		
3	include federal land. Although a Waianae watershed management		
4	plan was prepared for the Honolulu board of water supply, a		
5	study focused specifically on Makaha Valley is vital to identify		
6	specific recommendations for the control of storm drainage to		
7	reduce recurring flooding to residences and businesses in the		
8	area.		
9	The purpose of this Act is to require the department of		
10	land and natural resources to conduct a flood study for Makaha		
11	Valley.		
12	SECTION 2. (a) The department of land and natural		
13	resources shall conduct a flood study for Makaha Valley on the		
14	island of Oahu. The flood study shall include but not be		
15	limited to:		
16	(1) Specific recommendations for the control of storm		
17	damage throughout Makaha Valley to reduce repetitive		
18	flooding to residences and businesses in the area;		
19	(2) A cost-benefit analysis of the recommendations		
20	proposed;

1	(3)	Identification and evaluation of the desired,
2	·	intended, and potential unintended effects of the
3		recommendations;
4	(4)	A timetable for the implementation of the
5		recommendations; and
6	(5)	Any other issues deemed necessary or relevant by the
7		chairperson of the board of land and natural
8		resources.
9	(b)	The department of land and natural resources shall
10	submit a	written report of findings and recommendations,
11	including	any necessary proposed legislation, to the legislature
12	no later	than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
13	session o	f 2013.
