BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 (b) A state agency may include a provision in a contract
- 2 awarded under this chapter a requirement that the provider
- 3 participate in planning pursuant to subsection (a); provided
- 4 that notice of this requirement shall be provided in the request
- 5 for proposals; and provided further that participation in
- 6 planning pursuant to subsection (a) [shall be encouraged, and,
- 7 as determined by rules, shall not disqualify [providers] a
- 8 provider from submitting responses to requests for proposals."
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 11 begun before its effective date.
