HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO AMEND ITS ADMINISTRATIVE RULES TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF LAY GILL NETS FOR CATCHING OIO.

1	WHEREAS, Hawaii is an island state with a unique marine
2	environment that consists of numerous species of fish and marine
3	life, including the bonefish, which is more commonly referred to
4	as oio in Hawaii; and
5	
6	WHEREAS, oio is one of the premiere sport fishes in the
7	world; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, oio are used in food products, such as fishcake;
10	and
11	
12	WHEREAS, a growing number of sport fishers, particularly,
13	fly fishers, are seeking out areas to fish for oio; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, this has made oio into an economic resource beyond
16	the value of a commercial catch; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, for example, in areas such as Florida, a single
19	oio can generate approximately \$3,500 worth of revenue for the
20	state, taking into account the value of plane tickets, guide
21	services, fishing tours, and equipment rentals; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, Hawaii's commercial oio catch using fish nets in
24	2010 was 1,500 fish; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, if Florida revenue estimates were applied to
27	Hawaii's oio catch through netting, the value of that catch
28	would be approximately \$5,250,000; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, although lay gill nets have been used in Hawaii

for decades, they are destructive because while efficient, lay

gill nets are indiscriminate in the fish and marine life that they catch; and

WHEREAS, abandoned lay gill nets continue to kill marine life, can break off or destroy coral formations, and create marine debris: and

WHEREAS, in an attempt to protect nearshore waters from overfishing, the Department of Land and Natural Resources has established administrative rules that regulate the use of lay gill nets by prohibiting them in certain areas, including around the entire island of Maui, along portions of the west coast of the island of Hawaii, and along portions of the southeast shores of the island of Oahu; and

WHEREAS, expanding this prohibition to include the taking of oio from all waters of the State using lay gill nets would help to protect this species of fish and would allow for the establishment of a sport fishing revenue generator for the State of Hawaii; now, therefore,

 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2012, that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested to amend its administrative rules to prohibit the use of lay gill nets for catching oio in the waters of the State; and

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, and Attorney General.
