HOUSE RESOLUTION

REOUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF CERTAIN ISSUES RELATING TO RISING HEALTH INSURANCE PREMIUM COSTS, AS ADDRESSED BY HOUSE BILL NO. 1896, REGULAR SESSION 2012.

WHEREAS, rising health insurance premium costs are detrimental to the economic recovery of businesses in the State;

WHEREAS, restricting the increases in health insurance premium costs would help businesses in this State that are struggling to meet expenses; and

WHEREAS, reform of the health insurance medical loss ratio and rate regulation provisions of the State's insurance code would likely promote economic revitalization; and

WHEREAS, there are many important unresolved issues relating to the reform of the health insurance medical loss ratio and rate regulation provisions of the State's insurance code; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2012, that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to conduct a study of rising health insurance premium costs, as addressed by House Bill No. 1896, Regular Session of 2012, to examine any relevant issues, including the following:

- Whether a higher medical loss ratio would help to prevent increasing health insurance premium rates in Hawaii;
- (2) Whether a higher medical loss ratio would promote competition in the health insurance market in Hawaii;
- Whether it would be fair to apply a medical loss ratio (3) calculated according to the federal Patient Protection
