### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to reestablish the
- 2 governor's authority to nominate and, with the advice and
- 3 consent of the senate, appoint the members of the board of
- 4 regents of the University of Hawaii by repealing the candidate
- 5 advisory council for the board of regents of the University of
- 6 Hawaii; provided that this Act shall be implemented upon
- 7 ratification of the constitutional amendment to article X,
- 8 section 6, of the Hawaii State Constitution, which would delete
- 9 provisions related to the regents candidate advisory council.
- 10 It is the intent of the legislature that the existing
- 11 members of the board of regents of the University of Hawaii
- 12 serve their full terms of office. As each term expires, the
- 13 regent shall be replaced by a member nominated and, with the
- 14 advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the governor.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 304A-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 "§304A-104 Regents; appointment; tenure; qualifications;
- 18 meetings. (a) The affairs of the university shall be under the 2012-0044 SB SMA.doc



- 1 general management and control of the board of regents
- 2 consisting of fifteen members who shall be appointed and may be
- 3 removed by the governor. Except as otherwise provided by law,
- 4 state officers shall be eligible for appointment and membership.
- 5 The term of each member shall be five years, except as provided
- 6 for the initial appointment in section 26-11; provided that the
- 7 term of the student member shall be two years. Every member may
- 8 serve beyond the expiration date of the member's term of
- 9 appointment until the member's successor has been appointed by
- 10 the governor and confirmed by the senate in accordance with
- 11 article X, section 6 of the Hawaii Constitution. Members shall
- 12 serve no more than two consecutive five-year terms; provided
- 13 that the members who are initially appointed to terms of two
- 14 years or less pursuant to section 26-11(a) may be reappointed to
- 15 two ensuing five-year terms. If a member is to be appointed to
- 16 a second term of five years, the senate shall consider the
- 17 question of whether to reconfirm the member at least one hundred
- 18 twenty days prior to the conclusion of a member's first five-
- 19 year term; provided that if the senate is not in session within
- 20 one hundred twenty days prior to the conclusion of the member's
- 21 first five-year term, the member shall continue to serve until
- 22 the senate convenes for the next regular session or the next

- 1 special session for which the senate is authorized to consider
- 2 the question of reconfirmation.
- 3 (b) At a meeting preceding July 1 of each year, the board
- 4 of regents shall elect a chairperson and up to two vice-
- 5 chairpersons whose terms shall be from July 1 to June 30 of the
- 6 next year or thereafter until their successors are elected. The
- 7 board shall appoint a secretary, who shall not be a member of
- 8 the board. The president of the university shall act as
- 9 executive officer of the board. A majority of the board of
- 10 regents shall constitute a quorum to conduct business, and the
- 11 concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the board
- 12 of regents is entitled shall be necessary to make any action of
- 13 the board of regents valid. The board shall meet at least ten
- 14 times annually and, from time to time, may meet in each of the
- 15 counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai.
- 16 (c) [The governor shall notify the regents candidate
- 17 advisory council in writing within ten days of receiving
- 18 notification that a member of the board of regents is resigning,
- 19 has died, or is being removed by the governor.
- 20 (d) The members of the board of regents shall serve
- 21 without pay but shall be entitled to their travel expenses

         SECTION 3. Section 304A-104.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

    repealed.

- 9 SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the
- 10 existing members of the board of regents of the University of
- 11 Hawaii who are serving on the effective date of this Act shall
- 12 continue to serve their full terms of office. As each term
- 13 expires, each regent shall be replaced by a member nominated
- 14 and, with the advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the
- 15 governor pursuant to this Act.
- 16 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken.
- 18 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon the
- 19 ratification of a constitutional amendment authorizing the board
- 20 of regents of the University of Hawaii to be nominated and, with
- 21 the advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the governor

- 1 in compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution
- 2 of the State of Hawaii.
