A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CLIMATE CHANGE TASK FORCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that global warming poses a serious threat to the economic well-being, public health, 2 natural resources, and environment of Hawaii. The potential 3 4 adverse effects of climate change include a rise in sea levels, resulting in the displacement of businesses and residences and 5 the inundation of Hawaii's freshwater aquifers, damage to marine 6 7 ecosystems and the natural environment, extended drought and loss of soil moisture, an increase in the spread of infectious 8 9 diseases, and an increase in the severity of storms and extreme weather events. Climate change will have detrimental effects on 10 some of Hawaii's largest industries, including tourism, 11 agriculture, recreational and commercial fishing, and forestry 12 13 as well as Hawaii's fragile and unique natural resources. Accordingly, the State needs to be prepared to understand and 14 15 respond to the effects of climate change. While the legislature has taken actions to assess climate change in the past through 16 17 the creation of the climate change task force pursuant to Act 20, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, additional strategies need to 18

1	be further investigated and implemented and more time is needed			
2	for the climate change task force to conduct such an assessment.			
3	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish the climate			
4	change task force to continue to investigate and address the			
5	impact climate change has on the State of Hawaii.			
6	SECTION 2. (a) The climate change task force is			
7	established within the office of planning, for administrative			
8	purposes only. The task force shall have the following			
9	objectives:			
10	(1) Scope the current and potential impacts of global			
11	warming and climate change on the people, natural			
12	resources, and the economy of the State, including			
13	impacts on:			
14	(A) The visitor industry;			
15	(B) Intrastate and interstate air and sea			
16	transportation of cargo and persons;			
17	(C) Existing buildings and the public utilities			
18	infrastructure;			
19	(D) The health of the people of the State;			
20	(E) Native plants, animals, and ecosystems; and			
21	(F) Ground and surface water resources;			

1	(2)	Scope the potential impacts of rising ocean levels as		
2		a result of climate change on the people, natural		
3		resources, and the economy of the State, including		
4		impacts on:		
5		(A) The visitor industry;		
6		(B) Shoreline erosion;		
7		(C) Intrastate and interstate air and sea		
8		transportation of cargo and persons;		
9		(D) Existing buildings and the public utilities		
10		infrastructure;		
11		(E) The health of the people of the State; and		
12		(F) Native plants, animals, and ecosystems;		
13	(3)	Estimate the costs to the State of the adverse effects		
14		associated with climate change and rising sea levels;		
15		and		
16	(4)	Make recommendations to the legislature and the		
17		governor on measures that would address or mitigate		
18		the near- and long-term effects of climate change.		
19		Such measures may include:		
20		(A) Protecting against shoreline erosion;		
21		(B) Maintaining the visitor industry;		

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1		(C)	Relocating or armoring the transportation
2			infrastructure, such as airports, highways, and
3			ports;
4		(D)	Implementing restrictions on construction in
5			areas at risk for sea level rise and inundation;
6		(E)	Improving or hardening the public utilities
7			infrastructure, including communication lines,
8			power generation systems, water supply systems,
9			and wastewater treatment and disposal systems;
10		(F)	Preparing for health emergencies and impacts to
11			established emergency management systems; and
12		(G)	Preserving the health, biodiversity, and
13			resilience of terrestrial, freshwater, and marine
14			ecosystems.
15	(b)	The	climate change task force shall comprise the
16	following	:	
17	(1)	The	director of the office of planning, or the
18		dire	ctor's designee, who shall act as chairperson;
19	(2)	The	deputy director of the department of health's
20		envi	ronmental health administration, or the deputy
21		dire	ector's designee;

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1	(3)	The director of transportation, or the director's			
2		designee;			
3	(4)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural			
4		resources, or the chairperson's designee;			
5	(5)	The vice-director of civil defense of the department			
6		of defense, or the vice-director's designee;			
7	(6)	One member appointed by each of the mayors of Hawaii,			
8		Honolulu, Kauai, and Maui counties;			
9	(7)	Three members appointed by the president of the			
10		senate, of whom one shall be from an environmental			
11		organization;			
12	(8)	Three members appointed by the speaker of the house of			
13		representatives, of whom one shall be from an			
14		environmental organization;			
15	(9)	The director of the Center for Island Climate			
16		Adaptation and Policy at the University of Hawaii at			
17		Manoa; and			
18	(10)	One member from the Joint Institute for Marine and			
19		Atmospheric Research to be appointed by its			
20		administrative board.			
21	Memb	Members of the task force shall be exempt from section			
22	26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and serve without compensation,				
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- 1 but shall be reimbursed for expenses necessary for the
- 2 performance of their duties, including travel expenses.
- 3 (c) The task force shall:
- 4 (1) Submit a preliminary report of its findings and
- 5 recommendations, including any proposed legislation,
- 6 to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to
- 7 the convening of the regular session of 2013; and
- 8 (2) Submit a final report of its findings and
- 9 recommendations, including any proposed legislation,
- 10 to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to
- 11 the convening of the regular session of 2014.
- 12 (d) The office of planning shall provide administrative
- 13 and clerical support required by the task force.
- (e) The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2014.
- 15 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000 or so much
- 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the
- 18 purposes of this Act.
- 19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 20 planning for the purposes of this Act.

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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012. 1
