### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AQUATIC LIFE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 188, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§188- Selling of aquatic life for aquarium purposes
- 5 prohibited; penalties; fines. (a) For the purposes of this
- 6 section:
- "Aquarium fish collection" means the collection of any 7
- 8 marine or freshwater aquatic life.
- 9 "Aquarium fish permit" means a permit issued by the board
- 10 of land and natural resources for the taking of aquatic life and
- 11 for the use of fine mesh nets and traps to take salt water fish,
- freshwater non-game fish, or other aquatic life for aquarium 12
- 13 purposes.
- 14 "Aquarium purposes" means to hold salt water fish,
- 15 freshwater non-game fish, or other aquatic life alive in a state
- of captivity as pets, for scientific study, for public 16
- 17 exhibition or display for public education, or for sale for
- 18 these purposes.

1 "Aquatic life" means any type or species of mammal, fish, amphibian, reptile, mollusk, crustacean, arthropod, 2 3 invertebrate, coral, or other animal that inhabits the freshwater or marine environment and includes any part, product, 4 5 egg, or offspring thereof; or freshwater or marine plants, 6 including seeds, roots, products, and other parts thereof. 7 "Department" means the department of land and natural 8 resources. 9 "Sell" means to transfer, prescribe, give, or deliver to another, to leave, barter, or exchange with another, or to offer 10 11 or agree to do the same to another for consideration. 12 "Take" or "taken" means to fish, catch, capture, confine, 13 or harvest aquatic life, or attempt to fish, catch, capture, 14 confine, or harvest aquatic life. 15 (b) It shall be unlawful for any person at any time to 16 knowingly or intentionally sell or offer to sell, for aquarium 17 purposes, aquatic life taken from any of the waters within the 18 jurisdiction of the State. 19 (c) This section shall not apply to a person exercising a 20 customary and traditional right for subsistence, cultural, or 21 religious purposes, subject to the right of the State to 22 regulate that right, including native Hawaiian gathering rights

12	dealer sh	all issue receipts to the person from whom marine life
13	is obtain	ed and shall provide the following information in the
14	receipt:	
15	(1)	The date of the issuance;
16	(2)	The name of the person to whom the receipt is issued;
17	(3)	The following information with respect to each of the
18		varieties of marine life as the department shall
19		require including:
20		(A) The weight in pounds of each of the varieties
21		received;

1	(B) The numbers of marine life when they average a
2	pound or more; and
3	(C) The price per pound paid; and
4	[ <del>(D)</del> With regard to aquarium fish, regardless of
5	weight, the number and species of the fishes;
6	and]
7	(4) The signature of the dealer who issues the receipt.
8	Any dealer taking the dealer's own marine life or handling any
9	marine life taken by commercial marine licensees working for or
10	with the dealer, shall make out the same receipt, giving market
11	price for the marine life as prevails on the date of receipt. A
12	duplicate copy of this receipt shall be kept on file at the
13	premise where the marine life was sold by the dealer issuing the
14	same for a period of twelve months from the date of issuance,
15	and the duplicate copy shall be available for inspection upon
16	the demand of any conservation officer authorized to enforce the
17	laws of the State."
18	SECTION 5. Section 188-31.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	repealed.
