# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ACCUSED TO TRANSPORT WITNESS OR WITNESSES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	'ION 1	. Chapter 571, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated			
3	and to read as follows:			
4	"§571- Accused to transport witness or witnesses. (a)			
5	In any criminal matter triable in the family courts of the			
6	various circuit courts, the court may require the accused to			
7	transport a witness or witnesses, including a complaining			
8	witness or witnesses, to any court proceeding, whenever any of			
9	the follo	wing	conditions are met:	
10	(1)	The	accused agrees to transport the witness or	
11		witn	esses to court;	
12	(2)	<u>The</u>	prosecution has made a showing that:	
13		(A)	Each witness has information material to the	
14			determination of a fact at issue;	
15		<u>(B)</u>	Each witness is a minor, elderly person, or	
16			incapacitated person, residing or believed to be	
17			residing at the same address or residential unit	
18			as the accused;	

1	<u>(C)</u>	The prosecution has made reasonably diligent
2		efforts to obtain the attendance of the witness
3		or witnesses in court through service of process;
4		and
5	<u>(D)</u>	Those efforts have been unsuccessful; or
6	<u>(3)</u> The	prosecution has made a showing that:
, 7	(A)	Each witness has information material to the
8		determination of a fact at issue;
9	<u>(B)</u>	Each witness is a minor, elderly person, or
10		incapacitated person; and
11	(C)	The accused has sole physical or legal custody of
12		the witness or witnesses.
13	(b) As u	sed in this section:
14	"Minor" m	neans a person less than eighteen years of age;
15	"Elderly	person" means a person sixty years of age or over;
16	and	
17	"Incapaci	tated person" means a person who is physically or
18	mentally incap	pable of transporting himself or herself to court."
19	SECTION 2	2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.
