A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ACCUSED TO TRANSPORT WITNESS OR WITNESSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 571, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§571- Accused to transport witness or witnesses. (a)
5	In any criminal matter triable in the family courts of the
6	various circuit courts, the court may require the accused to
7	transport a witness or witnesses, including a complaining
8	witness or witnesses, to any court proceeding, whenever the
9	following conditions are met:
10	(1) The accused agrees to transport the witness or
11	witnesses to court; and
12	(2) The prosecution has made a showing that each witness
13	has information material to the determination of a
14	fact at issue and is a minor, elderly person, or
15	incapacitated person who:
16	(A) Is residing or believed to be residing at the
17	same address or residential unit as the accused,
18	and the prosecution's reasonable diligent efforts

1	to obtain the attendance of the witness or
2	witnesses in court through service of process
3	have been unsuccessful; or
4	(B) Is under the sole physical or legal custody of
5	the accused.
6	(b) As used in this section:
7	"Elderly person" means a person sixty years of age or over.
8	"Incapacitated person" means a person who is physically or
9	mentally incapable of transporting himself or herself to court."
10	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
