A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH INSURANCE EXCHANGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that health insurance
 exchanges established in the Patient Protection and Affordable
 Care Act of 2010 are intended to support consumers and their
 access to quality affordable health care as well as information
 that will help consumers to make informed decisions regarding
 health care.

- 14 SECTION 2. Section 435H-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 16 and to read as follows:
- ""Consumer" means a person who, after January 1, 2014,
- 18 receives health care benefits through the Hawaii health



- 1 insurance exchange or a parent or guardian whose dependents
- 2 receive health care benefits through the Hawaii health insurance
- 3 exchange. Until the Hawaii health insurance exchange is
- 4 operational on January 1, 2014, a "consumer" representative may
- 5 be more broadly construed to be a person likely to use the
- 6 exchange to obtain health insurance or a representative of an
- 7 organization whose mission includes work on behalf of the
- 8 medically underserved."
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 435H-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:
- "(q) The connector shall make qualified plans and
- 12 qualified dental plans available to qualified individuals and
- 13 qualified employers beginning with effective dates on or before
- 14 January 1, 2014[-] and the basic health plan as defined in the
- 15 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 (P.L. 111-
- 16 148) available to qualified individuals and qualified employers
- 17 on or before January 1, 2015."
- 18 SECTION 4. Section 435H-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 20 "(b) The membership of the board shall reflect geographic
- 21 statewide diversity, including representation from all islands,
- 22 and the diverse interests of stakeholders including consumers,



employers, insurers, and dental benefit providers. The director 1 of commerce and consumer affairs or the director's designee, the 2 director of health or the director's designee, the director of 3 human services or the director's designee, and the director of 4 labor and industrial relations or the director's designee shall 5 be ex-officio, voting members of the board." 6 SECTION 5. Act 205, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, section 7 4, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 8 There shall be an interim board of the Hawaii health 9 connector in the department of commerce and consumer affairs for 10 administrative purposes only that shall recommend to the 11 12 legislature policies and procedures to further define and operate the Hawaii health connector established under section 3 13 of this Act. The interim board shall consist of [fifteen] 14 sixteen members who are representative of the stakeholders in 15 the Hawaii health connector and shall include members with 16 expertise in the financial, health care, information technology, 17 organizational management, and nonprofit industries. Members of 18 the interim board shall be designated by the governor based upon 19 recommendations by the insurance commissioner and to the extent 20 possible shall come from the members of the task force 21
