A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PAID LEAVE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The federal Individuals with Disabilities SECTION 1. 1 2 Education Act governs how states and public agencies provide early intervention, special education, and related services to 3 4 children with disabilities. The department of health is the 5 lead agency for the implementation of Part C of Individuals with Disabilities Education Act for the State. The department's 6 7 early intervention section is responsible for ensuring that 8 Hawaii meets all federal requirements and regulations and providing services to support the development of infants and 9 10 toddlers with special needs from birth to three years of age. 11 Federal regulations require the scheduling of a Part C Transition Conference for a child when they are between the age 12 of two years three months and two years nine months. 13 14 conference is intended to support a smooth transition from 15 Hawaii's early intervention program to the department of 16 education's preschool special education program. - for their child and discuss and share their child's strengths 1
- 2 and weaknesses with a care coordinator, community providers, and
- 3 department of education representatives.
- The purpose of this Act is to: 4
- Allow employees to be eligible for up to two hours of 5 (1)paid leave during normal business hours to attend a 6 transition conference regarding the options available 7 as their child exits the State's early intervention 8 services program; and 9
- (2) Define "parent" to include a legal parent, guardian, **10** or any other person acting in the place of a parent. 11
- SECTION 2. Section 78-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows:
- 14 "\$78-31 Paid leave; education of children. (a) Employees shall be eligible for up to two hours of paid leave during 15 normal business hours to attend [either:] a mutually-scheduled: 16
- (1) [A mutually-scheduled parent-teacher] Parent-teacher **17** conference for the employee's child attending a public 18 or private school in grades kindergarten through 19 twelve; [or] 20
- [A mutually-scheduled parent-caregiver] Parent-teacher 21 (2) conference for a preschool-aged child attending a 22
