A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAID.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Independently performing activities of daily
- 2 living can become more difficult for individuals as they age. A
- 3 large portion of Hawaii's aging population is medicaid-eligible
- 4 and find themselves in need of long-term care. Due to a
- 5 shortage of care providers in Hawaii, the preference of the
- 6 elderly to age in place with their families, and the high cost
- 7 of long-term care, family caregiving has become more prevalent.
- 8 However, family caregivers are often uncompensated for their
- 9 services. According to a recent report by the AARP Public
- 10 Policy Institute in Washington, D.C., Hawaii has 169,000
- 11 caregivers at any given time who provide unpaid assistance to
- 12 elderly, chronically ill, or disabled family members or friends.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to allow medicaid recipients who
- 14 receive long-term care the option of using medicaid funds to pay
- 15 family members for in-home care services.
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 346D-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 18 and to read as follows:
