### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State is
  vulnerable to a wide range of natural and man-made hazards which
  threaten the life, health, and safety of its people; damage and
  destroy property; disrupt services and everyday business and
- 5 recreational activities; and impede economic development.
- 6 Growth in the State's population especially in the numbers of
- 7 businesses and persons residing in coastal areas, in the elderly
- 8 population, in the number of seasonal vacationers, and in the
- 9 number of persons with special needs has greatly complicated
- 10 the State's ability to coordinate its emergency management
- 11 resources and activities.
- 12 The legislature also finds that the statutes pertaining to
- 13 the civil defense system of the State were enacted at a very
- 14 different time in the history of Hawaii. Chapter 127, Hawaii
- 15 Revised Statutes, was enacted in 1949, at a time when Hawaii's
- 16 population was less than half of what it is today. Chapter 128,
- 17 Hawaii Revised Statutes, is based on the Federal Civil Defense
- 18 Act of 1950, which was enacted for the purpose of preparing the 2012-0231 SB SMA.doc

2	level, th	e civil defense system is obsolete and has been
3	replaced	by a federal emergency management system.
4	The	purpose of this Act is to create a task force to:
5	(1)	Determine whether chapters 127 and 128, Hawaii Revised
6		Statutes, should be amended, repealed, or added to in
7		order to ensure that preparations of this State are
8		adequate in reducing vulnerability to, and recovering
9		from, emergencies and disasters; and
10	(2)	Recommend legislation in one or more areas relating to
11		emergency management and preparedness if it determines
12		that chapters 127 and 128 should be amended, repealed,
13		or supplemented.
14	SECT	ION 2. (a) There shall be established a task force
15	that shal	1:
16	(1)	Determine whether chapters 127 and 128, Hawaii Revised
17		Statutes, should be amended, repealed, or supplemented
18		to ensure that preparations of this State are adequate

in reducing vulnerability to, and recovering from,

emergencies and disasters; and

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1	(2)	Recommend legislation in one or more of the following			
2		areas if it determines that chapters 127 and 128			
3		shou	ald be amended, repealed, or supplemented by:		
4		(A)	Reducing the vulnerability to natural or man-made		
5			hazards of the people and property of this State;		
6		(B)	Preparing for the efficient evacuation and		
7			shelter of persons threatened or affected by		
8			natural or man-made hazards;		
9		(C)	Providing for the rapid and orderly provision of		
10			relief in the event of an emergency or disaster;		
11		(D)	Providing for the restoration of services and		
12			property in the event of an emergency or		
13			disaster; and		
14		(E)	Providing for the coordination of activities		
15			relating to emergency preparedness, mitigation,		
16			response, and recovery among and between agencies		
17			and officials of this State and agencies and		
18			officials of other states, local and federal		
19			governments, interstate organizations, and the		
20			private sector.		
21	(b)	The	members of the task force shall be as follows:		

1	(1)	A representative of the Federal Emergency Management
2		Agency, Region IX, U.S. Department of Homeland
3		Security;
4	(2)	The chair of the senate committee on public safety,
5		government operations, and military affairs, to serve
6		as co-chair;
7	(3)	The chair of the house committee on public safety and
8		military affairs, to serve as co-chair;
9	(4)	The attorney general, or the attorney general's
10		designee;
11	(5)	The director of health, or the director's designee;
12	(6)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
13		resources, or the chairperson's designee;
14	(7)	The director of public safety, or the director's
15		designee;
16	(8)	The director of finance, or the director's designee;
17	(9)	The director of transportation, or the director's
18		designee;
19	(10)	A representative of the civil defense division of the
20		department of defense;
21	(11)	A representative of the Hawaii national guard;
22	(12)	One member selected by the president of the senate;
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1	(13)	One member selected by the speaker of the house of
2		representatives;
3	(14)	The mayors of the counties of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii
4		and the City and County of Honolulu, or each mayor's
5		respective designee;
6	(15)	The police chiefs of the counties of Kauai, Maui, and
7	•	Hawaii, and the City and County of Honolulu, or each
8		police chief's respective designee; and
9	(16)	The fire chiefs of the counties of Kauai, Maui, and
10		Hawaii, and the City and County of Honolulu, or each
11		fire chief's respective designee.
12	(c)	The task force shall meet a minimum of five times
13	between J	uly 1, 2012, and December 31, 2012.
14	(d)	The task force shall report its findings and
15	recommend	ations, including proposed legislation, if any, to the
16	legislatu	re no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
17	the regul	ar session of 2013.
18	(e)	The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2013.
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SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
