A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to part VII to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§27- Broadband-related permits; automatic approval.
5	(a) The State shall approve, approve with modification, or
6	disapprove all applications for broadband-related permits within
7	forty-five business days of submission of a complete permit
8	application and full payment of any applicable fee. If on the
9	forty-sixth business day an application is not approved,
10	approved with modification, or disapproved by the State, it
11	shall be deemed approved by the State.
12	(b) Permits issued pursuant to this section shall contain
13	the following language: "This is a broadband-related permit
14	issued pursuant to section 27- , Hawaii Revised Statutes.".
15	(c) No action shall be prosecuted or maintained against
16	the State, its officials, or employees on account of actions
17	taken in reviewing, approving, modifying, or disapproving a
18	permit application.

1	(d) The forty-five business day time period established by
2	this section shall be extended in the event of a natural
3	disaster, state emergency, or union strike that prevents the
4	applicant, agency, or a department from fulfilling application
5	review requirements.
6	(e) If an application is incomplete, the State shall
7	notify the applicant in writing within ten business days of
8	submittal of the application. The notice shall inform the
9	applicant of the specific requirements necessary to complete the
10	application. The forty-five business day automatic approval
11	provisions under subsection (a) shall continue to apply to the
12	application only if the applicant satisfies the specific
13	requirements of the notice and submits a complete application
14	within five business days of receipt of the notice.
15	(f) The upgrading and replacement of, and access to, any
16	utility pole as in relation to a broadband-related permit
17	application subject to this section shall be in conformance with
18	section 3 of Act 151, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011.
19	(g) For the purposes of this section, "broadband-related
20	permits" means all state permits required to commence actions
21	with respect to the installation, improvement, construction, or
22	development of infrastructure relating to broadband service or

- 1 broadband technology, including the interconnection of
- 2 telecommunications cables, cable installation, tower
- 3 construction, undersea boring, or the landing of an undersea
- 4 cable. The term does not include any state permit for which the
- 5 approval of a federal agency is explicitly required pursuant to

- 7 approval by the State."
- 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 9 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 "\$46- Broadband-related permits; automatic approval.
- 12 (a) A county shall approve, approve with modification, or
- 13 disapprove all applications for broadband-related permits within
- 14 forty-five business days of submission of a complete permit
- 15 application and full payment of any applicable fee. If on the
- 16 forty-sixth business day an application is not approved,
- 17 approved with modification, or disapproved by the county, it
- 18 shall be deemed approved by the county.
- (b) Permits issued pursuant to this section shall contain
- 20 the following language: "This is a broadband-related permit
- 21 <u>issued pursuant to section 46-</u>, Hawaii Revised Statutes.".

1	(c) No action shall be prosecuted or maintained against
2	any county, its officials, or employees on account of actions
3	taken in reviewing, approving, modifying, or disapproving a
4	permit application.
5	(d) The forty-five business day time period established by
6	this section shall be extended in the event of a natural
7	disaster, state emergency, or union strike that prevents the
8	applicant, agency, or a department from fulfilling application
9	review requirements.
10	(e) If an application is incomplete, the county agency
11	shall notify the applicant in writing within ten business days
12	of submittal of the application. The notice shall inform the
13	applicant of the specific requirements necessary to complete the
14	application. The forty-five business day automatic approval
15	provisions under subsection (a) shall continue to apply to the
16	application only if the applicant satisfies the specific
17	requirements of the notice and submits a complete application
18	within five business days of receipt of the notice.
19	(f) The upgrading and replacement of, and access to, any
20	utility pole in relation to a broadband-related permit
21	application subject to this section shall be in conformance with
22	section 3 of Act 151, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011.

1	(g) For the purposes of this section, "broadband-related
2	permits" means all county permits required to commence actions
3	with respect to the installation, improvement, construction, or
4	development of infrastructure relating to broadband service or
5	broadband technology, including the interconnection of
6	telecommunications cables, cable installation, tower
7	construction, and undersea boring, or the landing of an undersea
8	cable. The term does not include any county permit for which
9	the approval of a federal agency is explicitly required pursuant
10	to federal law, rule, or regulation, prior to granting final
11	permit approval by a county."
12	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
14	and shall be repealed on June 30, 2017; provided that this Act
15	shall apply to permit applications filed with the State or a
16	county after December 31, 2012.

Broadband Permits; Automatic Approval; Construction

Description:

Requires the State and counties to approve, approve with modification, or disapprove all broadband related permits within forty-five business days. Provides that if no action is taken, the application will be deemed approved on the forty-sixth business day. Sunsets on June 30, 2017. (HB2325 HD2)
