## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 4 Broadband-related permits; automatic approval.

- 8 application and full payment of any applicable fee. If on the
- 9 sixty-first business day an application is not approved,
- 10 approved with modification, or disapproved by the State, it
- 11 shall be deemed approved by the State.
- 12 (b) Permits issued pursuant to this section shall contain
- 13 the following language: "This is a broadband-related permit
- 14 issued pursuant to section 27- , Hawaii Revised Statutes.".

- 16 the State, its officials, or employees on account of actions
- **17** taken in reviewing, approving, modifying, or disapproving a

## Report Title:

Broadband Permits; Automatic Approval; Infrastructure

## Description:

Requires the State and counties to approve, approve with modification, or disapprove all broadband-related permits within sixty business days or the application will be deemed approved on the sixty-first business day. Prior to any public notice and public hearing required under law, requires the owner or owners of a property within a radius of fifty yards of a project relating to the installation, improvement, construction, or development of infrastructure relating to broadband service or broadband technology, to be notified of the project. Effective July 1, 2112. Sunsets on June 30, 2017. (SB2235 HD2)
