### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTERNET DATING SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 481B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to rea	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§48</u>	1B- Internet dating services; safety awareness
5	notificat	ion. (a) An internet dating service offering services
6	to Hawaii	members shall provide a safety awareness notification
7	that incl	udes, at a minimum, a list and description of safety
8	measures	reasonably designed to increase awareness of safer
9	dating pro	actices in a clear and conspicuous manner. The
10	notificat	ion shall include but not be limited to statements that
11	are substa	antially similar to the following:
12	(1)	"Anyone who is able to commit identity theft can also
13		<pre>falsify a dating profile.";</pre>
14	(2)	"There is no substitute for acting with caution when
15		communicating with any stranger who wants to meet
16		you.";
17	<u>(3)</u>	"Never include your last name, e-mail address, home
18		address, telephone or cell phone number, place of

1		work, or any other identifying information in your
2		internet profile or initial e-mail messages. Stop
3		communicating with anyone who pressures you for
4		personal or financial information or attempts in any
5		way to trick you into revealing it."; and
6	(4)	"If you choose to have a face-to-face meeting with
7		another member, always tell someone in your family or
8		a friend where you are going and when you will return.
9		Never agree to be picked up at your home. Always
10		provide your own transportation to and from your date
11		and meet in a public place with many people around.".
12	The :	notification shall be given at the time a Hawaii member
13	registers	with the service and by way of a link on the main
14	website,	or the first entry point, of the service.
15	(b)	If an internet dating service does not conduct
16	criminal	background screenings on its members, the service shall
17	disclose,	clearly and conspicuously, to all Hawaii members that
18	the inter	net dating service does not conduct criminal background
19	screening	s. The disclosure shall be provided in two or more of
20	the follow	wing forms:
21	<u>(1)</u>	When an electronic mail message is sent or received by
22		a Hawaii member;

1	(2)	In a "click-through" or other similar presentation
2		requiring a member from this State to acknowledge that
3		they have received the information required by this
4		section;
5	(3)	On the profile describing a member to a Hawaii member;
6		<u>or</u>
7	(4)	On the website pages or home page of the internet
8		dating service used when a Hawaii member signs up.
9	A disclos	ure under this subsection shall be in bold, capital
10	<u>letters</u> i	n at least twelve-point type.
11	(c)	If an internet dating service conducts criminal
12	backgroun	d screenings on all of its communicating members, then
13	the servi	ce shall disclose, clearly and conspicuously, to all
14	<u>Hawaii</u> me	mbers that the internet dating service conducts a
15	criminal	background screening on each member prior to permitting
16	a Hawaii	member to communicate with another member. The
17	disclosur	e shall be provided on the website pages used when a
18	<u>Hawaii me</u>	mber signs up. A disclosure under this subsection
19	shall be	in bold, capital letters in at least twelve-point type.
20	(d)	If an internet dating service conducts criminal
21	backgroun	d screenings, the service shall:

1	(1)	Disc	lose whether it has a policy allowing a member who
2		has	been identified as having a criminal conviction to
3		have	access to its service to communicate with any
4		<u>Hawa</u>	ii member; and
5	(2)	Stat	e in substantially similar language that:
6		<u>(A)</u>	Criminal background screenings are not foolproof,
7			may give members a false sense of security, and
8			are not a perfect safety solution;
9		<u>(B)</u>	Criminals may circumvent even the most
10			sophisticated search technology;
11		<u>(C)</u>	Not all criminal records are public in all states
12			and not all databases are up-to-date;
13		<u>(D)</u>	Only publicly available convictions are included
14		`	in the screenings; and
15		<u>(E)</u>	Screenings do not cover other types of
16			convictions or arrests or any convictions from
17			foreign countries.
18	<u>(e)</u>	The	attorney general may bring an action against an
19	internet	datin	g service that violates this section to:
20	(1)	Enjo	in further violation of this section; and
21	(2)	Reco	ver up to \$250 for each Hawaii member registered
22		with	the internet dating service during the time

1	period that the internet dating service was in
2	violation of this section. In an action under this
3	paragraph, a court may increase the damages up to
4	three times the damages allowed where the defendant
5	has been found to have engaged in a pattern and
6	practice of violating this section.
7	(f) No internet dating service shall be deemed to have
8	violated this section if the internet dating service shows, by a
9	preponderance of the evidence, that the violation was not
10	intentional and resulted from a bona fide error made
11	notwithstanding the maintenance of procedures reasonably adopted
12	to avoid the error.
13	(g) Nothing in this section shall be construed to restrict
14	any right that any person may have under any other statute or
15	common law.
16	(h) An internet service provider does not violate this
17	section solely as a result of serving as an intermediary for the
18	transmission of electronic messages between members of an
19	internet dating service.
20	(i) As used in this section:
21	"Hawaii member" means a member who provides an in-state
22	billing address or zip code when registering with the service.
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1	"Internet dating service" means a person or entity directly
2	or indirectly in the business, for profit, of offering,
3	promoting, or providing access to dating, relationship,
4	compatibility, matrimonial, or social referral services
5	principally on or through the Internet.
6	"Internet service provider" means any person, business, or
7	organization qualified to do business in this State that
8	provides individuals, corporations, or other entities with the
9	ability to connect to the Internet through equipment that is
10	located in this State.
11	"Member" means a customer, client, or participant who
12	submits to an internet dating service information required to
13	access the service for the purpose of engaging in dating,
14	relationship, compatibility, matrimonial, or social referral."
15	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
16	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
17	begun before its effective date.
18	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
19	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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### Report Title:

Internet Dating Services; Safety Awareness Notification

### Description:

Requires internet dating services to provide safety awareness notification to their Hawaii members. Authorizes the AG to bring an action against violators.

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
