A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VEHICLE PLATES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 249, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 2 and to read as follows: 3
- Number plates; county determination. Each county 4 "§249shall determine whether the county shall require two number 5 plates or one number plate for a vehicle registered in the 6 county; provided that if the county determines that one number 7
- plate is sufficient, the plate shall be placed on the rear of 8 9 the vehicle."
- SECTION 2. Section 249-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 11 amended as follows:
- 1. By amending subsections (a) and (b) to read: 12
- "(a) Upon receipt of the tax the director of finance shall 13 number and register the vehicle in the owner's name in a 14 permanent record or book to be kept by the director for this 15 purpose, and shall furnish the owner thereof with a receipt 16 showing upon its face the license number issued for the vehicle
- and the fact that the license tax has been paid thereon for the 18

whole or the remainder of the current year in which the receipt

    is issued. The director of finance shall also furnish the
2
    owner, upon the original registration of the vehicle, [two] the

    appropriate number plate or plates for the vehicle [or one plate

    in the case of trailers, semitrailers, or motorcycles] with the

    registration number marked thereon. Upon the payment of the tax
6

    for each year a tag or emblem bearing a serial number and the
    month and year of expiration shall be provided to the owner.

    Transfer of the current number plate or plates [-7] and tag [-7] or

    emblem, except as authorized by this chapter or by chapter 286,

    is punishable by a fine of not more than $50 for each offense.
         (b) Upon an original registration the director of finance

    shall fix, and shall charge to the owner, a fee equal to the

    cost of the number plate and tag or emblem plus the

    administrative cost of furnishing the plate and tag or emblem
    and effecting the registration. Upon the issuance of a new
16
    series of number plates as determined by the directors of
17
    finance of each county through majority consent, the director of

    finance shall charge the owner a fee equal to the costs of the
    number plate plus the administrative cost of furnishing the

    plate or plates. Upon issuing a tag or emblem, the director of
    finance shall charge the owner a fee of 50 cents.

- 1 shall securely fasten the number plates on the vehicle, one on
- 2 the front and the other on the rear $[\tau]$ in the case of two
- 3 plates, or on the rear, in the case of one plate, at a location
- 4 provided by the manufacturer or in the absence of such a
- 5 location upon the bumpers of the vehicle and in conformance with
- 6 section 291-31, in such a manner as to prevent the plates from
- 7 swinging. Number plates shall at all times be displayed
- 8 entirely unobscured and be kept reasonably clean. [In the case
- 9 of trailers, semitrailers, or motorcycles, one plate shall be
- 10 used and it-shall be fastened to the rear thereof at a location
- 11 provided by the manufacturer or in the absence of such a
- 12 location at the rear thereof, and in the case of motorcycles in
- 13 conformance-with section 291-31.]"
- 14 2. By amending subsection (e) to read:
- 15 "(e) If an owner of a vehicle registered in any county,
- 16 upon the disposition of the vehicle, requests that the [license]
- 17 number plate or plates furnished to the owner with respect to
- 18 the registration of the vehicle be assigned to another vehicle
- 19 subsequently acquired by the owner, the assignment may be made
- 20 by the director of finance at the director's discretion. To
- 21 defray additional administrative costs incurred by acceding to
- 22 those requests, the director of finance shall charge a fee of



- 1 [\$5] \$75 for each reassignment of [license] number plate or
- 2 plates, in addition to the fee for registration. The procedure
- 3 for registering the vehicles shall otherwise be identical with
- 4 that provided by this section."
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 249-7.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 "\$249-7.5 New motor vehicle with a temporary number plate.
- 8 Any person who has purchased a new motor vehicle which has
- 9 attached a temporary number plate under section 286-53 shall
- 10 register the new motor vehicle in accordance with this chapter
- 11 within thirty days after taking possession of the motor vehicle.
- 12 For the purposes of this chapter, the registration of such a
- 13 motor vehicle shall be considered an original registration under
- 14 section 249-7. Within thirty days of the original registration
- 15 of such a motor vehicle, the director of finance shall furnish
- 16 [two] the appropriate number plate or plates and the valid tag
- 17 or emblem appropriate for the year of registration, if any,
- 18 which shall be attached to the motor vehicle as provided under
- 19 section 249-7. Upon attachment of the number plates, the
- 20 temporary number plate provided under section 286-53 shall be
- 21 destroyed."

provided that applicants, except civilian applicants under paragraph (3) and civilian applicants and applicants who are currently serving the United States in the military under paragraph (6), shall also provide a copy of the applicant's most recent discharge paper or separation document that indicates an honorable discharge or general (under honorable conditions) discharge from active duty."
