BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 171-58.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 2 3 "\$171-58.5 Prohibitions. The mining or taking of sand, dead coral or coral rubble, rocks, soil, or other marine 4 5 deposits seaward from the shoreline is prohibited with the following exceptions: 6 The inadvertent taking from seaward of the shoreline 7 8 of [such] these materials, [not in excess of one 9 gallon per person per day for reasonable, personal, **10** noncommercial use;] such as those inadvertently 11 carried away on the body, and on clothes, toys, 12 recreational equipment, and bags; 13 (2) For the replenishment or protection of public shoreline areas and adjacent public lands seaward of 14 15 the shoreline, or construction or maintenance of state approved lagoons, harbors, launching ramps, or 16 17 navigational channels with a permit authorized under 18 chapter 183C;
