A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that residential care
- 2 facilities are an important option for elderly persons who
- 3 require living assistance, personal care services, and
- 4 appropriate medical care. Hawaii has a complex system of
- 5 residential care settings for adults unable to care for
- 6 themselves, including adult residential care homes, extended
- 7 care adult residential care homes, assisted living facilities,
- 8 nursing homes, and community care foster family homes.
- 9 The legislature finds that there is a division in
- 10 responsibility for regulating and overseeing residential care
- 11 facilities in the State. The department of health licenses
- 12 adult residential care homes, extended care adult residential
- 13 care homes, assisted living facilities, and nursing homes.
- 14 Community care foster family homes are licensed by the
- 15 department of human services.
- The legislature also finds that the State's home and
- 17 community-based residential care system would benefit from a

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- single governmental agency overseeing all aspects of residential 1 2 care facilities. 3 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a residential care facility reform task force to determine the 4 feasibility of a single agency overseeing all aspects of 5 6 residential care facilities. 7 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a residential care 8 facility reform task force within the department of health for 9 administrative purposes to consist of eleven members as follows: 10 (1) The director of health or the director's designee; The director of human services or the director's 11 (2) 12 designee; 13 A representative from a licensed adult residential (3) 14 care home; A representative from a licensed extended care adult 15 (4)
- 17 (5) A representative from a licensed assisted living

residential care home;

- 19 (6) A representative from a licensed nursing home;
- (7) A representative from a licensed community care fosterfamily home; and
- 22 (8) Four community stakeholders.

facility;

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- 2 task force shall choose a chairperson from among their
- 3 membership.
- 4 (c) The residential care facility reform task force shall:
- (1) Assess the current allocation of responsibilities for
 quality assurance across state departments;
- 7 (2) Review the standards and inspection processes for 8 residential care facilities and nursing homes;
- 9 (3) Recommend an integrated management strategy for adult residential care facilities; and
- 11 (4) Proposed amendments to existing law necessary to
 12 implement a single agency that would oversee all
 13 aspects of residential care facilities in the State.
- (d) Members of the residential care facility reform task
 force shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed
 for reasonable travel expenses.
- (e) The residential care facility reform task force shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2013.

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1 (f)	The	residential	care	facility	reform	task	force	shall
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- 2 cease to exist on June 30, 2013.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
