### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PSEUDOEPHEDRINE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 329-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 3 "(c) Stimulants. Unless specifically exempted or excluded or unless listed in another schedule, any material, compound, 4 5 mixture, or preparation that contains any quantity of the 6 following substances having a stimulant effect on the central 7 nervous system, including its salts, isomers, and salts of isomers[+]: pseudoephedrine or any drug containing 8 9 pseudoephedrine." 10 SECTION 2. Section 329-64, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 12 "(a) The requirements imposed by sections 329-62 and 329-13 63(a) [of this part] shall not apply to any of the following: 14 (1)Any pharmacist or other authorized person who sells or furnishes a substance upon the prescription of a 15 16 physician, dentist, podiatrist, or veterinarian;

1	(2)	Any physician, dentist, podiatrist, or veterinarian
2		who administers or furnishes a substance to patients;

4	(3)	Any manufacturer or wholesaler licensed by the State
5		who sells, transfers, or otherwise furnishes a
6		substance to a licensed pharmacy, physician, dentist,
7		podiatrist, or veterinarian[; and
8	<del>(4)</del>	Any sale, transfer, furnishing, or receipt of any drug
9		that contains pseudoephedrine or norpseudoephedrine
10		that is lawfully sold, transferred, or furnished over
11		the counter without a prescription pursuant to the
12		federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (21 United States
13		Gode-section 301 et seq.) or regulations adopted
14		thereunder as long as it complies with the
15		requirements of sections 329-73, 329-74, and 329-75]."
16	SECT	ION 3. Section 329-73, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	repealed.	
18	[" <del>[S</del>	329-73] Pseudoephedrine permit. (a) Beginning
19	<del>January 1</del>	, 2006, any person transporting by any means more than
20	three pac	kages of any product the sale of which is restricted by
21	section 3	29-75 shall obtain a pseudoephedrine permit.

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         (b) The requirements imposed by [subsection] (a) shall not
    apply to-persons-registered with the department-under section
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    329-67. A pseudoephedrine permit shall be issued by the
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    department in a form and manner as prescribed by the department
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 5
    by rule. A pseudoephedrine permit shall be valid for one year
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    and renewable annually."]
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         SECTION 4. Section 329-74, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    repealed.
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         ["[$329-74] Unlawful transport of pseudoephedrine. (a) A
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    person commits the offense-of unlawful transport of
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    pseudoephedrine if the person transports more than three
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    packages of any product the sale of which is restricted by
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    section 329-75 without a permit issued from the department.
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         (b) For purposes of this section, "transportation" means
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    the transfer of a pseudoephedrine product by a person other than
    a wholesaler, distributor, or retailer of such product
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    authorized to conduct business as such by the State.
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         (c) Unlawful transport of pseudoephedrine is a
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    misdemeanor."]
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         SECTION 5. Section 329-75, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
    repealed.

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1	<del>(3)-</del>	The pharmacy or retailer shall record, in an
2		electronic log on software provided by the narcotics
3		enforcement division of the department and approved by
4		the administrator:
5		(A) The date of any transaction under paragraph (2);
6		(B) The name, address, and date of birth of the
7		<del>person;</del>
8		(C) The type of identification provided by the
9		individual obtaining the substance;
10		(D) The agency issuing the identification used; and
11		(E) The name of the compound, mixture, or
12		preparation, and the amount; and
13	<del>(4)</del>	The pharmacy or retailer shall:
14		-(A) Record the information required under paragraph
15		(3) on an electronic worksheet on software
16		provided by the narcotics enforcement division of
17		the-department; and
18		(B) Electronically mail the worksheet record to the
19		narcotics enforcement division once a month.
20		The information shall be retained by the pharmacy or
21		retailer for a period of two years. The electronic
22		log shall be capable of being checked for compliance

1	against all state and federal laws, including
2	interfacing with other-states to ensure comprehensive
3	compliance, and shall be subject to random and
4	warrantless inspection by county or state law
5	enforcement-officers.
6	(b) No person shall knowingly purchase, possess, receive,
7	or otherwise acquire more than nine grams of any product,
8	mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of
9	pseudoephedrine or its salts, isomers, or salts of optical
10	isomers within a thirty-day period, except that this limit shall
11	not apply to any quantity of such product, mixture, or
12	preparation dispensed pursuant to a valid prescription.
13	(c) Any person who violates subsection (b) is guilty of a
14	class C felony.
15	(d) The department, by rule, may exempt other products
16	from this section, if the administrator finds that the products
17	are not used in the illegal manufacture of methamphetamine or
18	other controlled substances. A manufacturer of a drug product
19	may apply for removal of the product from this section if the
20	product is determined by the administrator to have been
21	formulated in such a way as to effectively prevent the
22	conversion of the active ingredient into methamphetamine.



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(e) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter to
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    the contrary, every wholesaler shall report to the administrator
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    all sales made to any retailer, of any product, mixture, or
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    preparation containing any detectable quantity of
    pseudoephedrine, its salts, optical isomers, or salts of optical
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    isomers, as the only active ingredient or in combination with
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    other active ingredients. The department shall provide a common
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    reporting form that contains at least the following information
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    about the product, mixture, or preparation:
         (1) Generic or other name;
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         (2) Quantity sold;

         (3) Date of sale;
         (4) Name and address of the wholesaler; and
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         (5) Name and address of the retailer.
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         (f) Intentional or knowing failure of a retailer or
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    pharmacy to transmit any information as required by this section
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    shall be a misdemeanor and shall result in the immediate
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    suspension of that retailer's ability to sell any product,
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    mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of
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    pseudoephedrine, its salts, optical isomers, or salts of optical
    isomers as the only active ingredient or in combination with
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- 1 other-active ingredients until-authorized by the
- 2 administrator."]

- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
