A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDSCAPING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's unique,
2	native, land plants contribute to the beauty of the island
3	state. They foster an understanding, appreciation, and respect
4	for Hawaiian history and culture. To ensure the continued
5	perpetuation of native Hawaiian land plants, public and private
6	entities must work together.
7	The purpose of this Act is to promote and use native
8	Hawaiian land plants in state and county landscaping projects.
9	SECTION 2. Section 103D-408, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

Requires all public landscaping, highway beautification, and road construction and improvement projects to include native Hawaiian land plants from a list compiled by DLNR. Restricts the use of wild plants. (SD1)
