A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIRE PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the statute on
- 2 approval of building plans by county fire chiefs was originally
- 3 enacted in 1945 and was last amended substantively in 1978.
- 4 Much has changed since then in the standards for building
- 5 occupancy and fire codes.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to clarify and update the duties
- 7 of the county fire chief in approving building plans to ensure
- 8 compliance with the fire code and building occupancy
- 9 requirements.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 132-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 "\$132-9 Submission of building plans for approval.
- 13 [Before work commences upon the construction of any building of
- 14 the types hereinafter enumerated, or upon an alteration or
- 15 addition to any building, the plans and specifications for the
- 16 work shall be submitted to the county fire chief. Neither the
- 17 person causing the construction, alteration, or addition to be
- 18 made, nor the person's architect or agent, shall authorize,

1	order, or	-permit the work thereon to start and no contractor,
2	builder,	or other person may start the work, before approval of
3	the plans	and specifications by the county fire chief.
4	The	foregoing provisions shall be applicable to buildings,
5	the whole	or any part of which are being, or intended to be,

7	(1)	Hospitals, sanitariums, asylums, children's nurseries,
8		and other such institutions;
9	(2)	Hotels, apartment houses, rooming houses, and tenement
10		houses; provided that when any such building to be
11		constructed or upon which alterations or additions are
12		to be made, is only one story high, with living
13		accommodations permanently designated and intended for
14		less than twenty-five persons, this section shall not
15		apply;
16	(3)	Schools, churches, auditoriums, halls, gymnasiums,
17		dance halls, nightclubs, factories, office buildings,
18		stores, and all other such buildings where persons
19		work, congregate, or assemble; provided that when any
20		such building to be constructed, or upon which
21		alterations or additions are to be made, is only one
22		story high, and is permanently designated and intended

2		one hundred persons, this section shall not apply.]							
3	(a) The	county fire chief may require plans and other							
4	documenta	tion to show compliance with the fire code and fire and							
5	life safety standards for the following:

7		to any building, structure, or property;							
8	(2)	Change in use of buildings or property, or change in							
9		occupancy; and							
10	(3)	Installation or alteration of any procedures,

14	(b)	No work on construction shall commence until:							
15	(1)	Plans and specifications are approved by the county							
16		fire chief and other agencies having jurisdiction; and

19	counties,	and other municipal subdivisions, and their officers,
