A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that from smart grid to
- 2 broadband, Hawaii is facing many new opportunities and
- 3 challenges in utility technologies and policies that are
- 4 reshaping our vision of the State's future, and in the process
- 5 redefining Hawaii's economy for decades to come. Yet in order
- 6 to successfully take advantage of these opportunities to
- 7 fundamentally improve Hawaii's network of infrastructure, our
- 8 regulatory bodies must effectively oversee and guide our
- 9 utilities on that path.
- 10 The legislature further finds that for the public utilities
- 11 commission to appropriately guide the development and
- 12 modernization of Hawaii's infrastructure in the twenty-first
- 13 century, its procedures and processes must reflect best
- 14 practices that most effectively help stakeholders navigate the
- 15 emerging economic, technological, and regulatory transformations
- 16 that are taking place in Hawaii's utility sector. From
- 17 increasing transparency and public access, to streamlining
- 18 internal and external procedures, to adopting the best

1	regulatory frameworks for fostering growth and development, it
2	is imperative that the commission use the necessary tools and
3	best practices to effectively and efficiently make informed
4	decisions about Hawaii's future infrastructure.
5	The purpose of this Act is to increase transparency and
6	efficiency at the public utilities commission by requiring the
7	adoption of best practices in relation to all commission
8	activities, both internal and external, to ensure the commission
9	is in the best position to guide the State in utility matters.
10	SECTION 2. Chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
12	and to read as follows:
13	"§269- Commission best practices. (a) The commission
14	shall integrate and implement best practices in the following
15	areas, including but not limited to:
16	(1) The use of innovative regulatory frameworks to solve
17	utility issues and concerns resulting from economic,
18	technological, and policy changes;
19	(2) The making and updating of rules and procedures that
20	streamline the internal and external procedures of the
21	commission, in particular streamlining and shortening
22	the timeframe of procedural actions; and

1	(3) The use of information technology to improve internal
2	workflow, transparency, and public access to filings
3	and data.
4	(b) The commission shall establish a system to gather,
5	assess, and update utility and regulatory best practices, and
6	implement appropriate best practices, particularly in areas set
7	forth in subsection (a).
8	(c) The commission shall submit an annual report to the
9	legislature on the progress made in implementing best practices
10	no later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular
11	session."
12	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$85,000 or so much
14	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013, to carry
15	out the purposes of this Act, including the hiring of necessary
16	consultants.
17	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the public
18	utilities commission for the purposes of this Act.
19	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
20	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
