### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DIGITAL MEDIA INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 201, part IX, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 2 is amended to read as follows: 3 "[f]PART IX.[f] HAWAII [TELEVISION AND] FILM AND DIGITAL 4 MEDIA DEVELOPMENT 5 [+] §201-111[+] Definitions. As used in this part: "Applicant" means a person applying for a grant [or venture 6 capital investment] from the board under this part. 7 8 "Board" means the Hawaii [television and] film and digital 9 media development board. "Eligible Hawaii project" or "project" means an 10 entertainment project in which at least seventy-five per cent of 11 12 the budget for the production costs, excluding salaries and costs for the producer, director, writer, screenplay, and actors 13 in the project, is dedicated for the purchase or lease of goods 14 15 or services from a vendor or supplier who is located and doing 16 business in the State. "Fund" means the Hawaii [television and] film and digital

The industrial and economic promotional activities of the department may include the use of literature, advertising, demonstrations, displays, market testing, lectures, travel, motion picture and slide films, and other promotional and publicity devices as may be appropriate; and

establish and update biennially a self-sufficiency standard that shall incorporate existing methods of calculation, and shall reflect, at a minimum, costs relating to housing, food, child care, transportation, health care, clothing and household expenses, federal and state tax obligations, family size, children's ages, geography, and the number of household wage earners. The department shall report to the legislature concerning the self-sufficiency standard no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2009, and every odd-numbered year thereafter. The recommendations shall address,

- 1 among other things, the use of any federal funding that may be available for the purposes of establishing 2 and updating the self-sufficiency standard. 3 4 The department shall be the central agency to coordinate 5 film and digital media permit activities in the State." SECTION 3. Section 201-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 7 amended as follows: 8 1. By amending the title to read: 9 "§201-14 Consolidated film and digital media permit processing." 10 2. By amending subsection (d) to read: 11 "(d) The department may approve and issue a permit to 12 [film] visually record at any of the sites identified by the 13 appropriate state or county agency under subsection (a). If any 14 15 site requested for use by the applicant is not identified under subsection (a), the department shall consult with the 16 appropriate state or county agency having jurisdiction over the · 17 site to obtain a permit. If the matter of a permit cannot be 18 19 resolved in this manner, the department shall refer the 20 application to the appropriate state or county agency to obtain 21 a permit."
