A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PATIENT-CENTERED MEDICAL HOMES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that uncoordinated health 2 care is associated with duplicate procedures, conflicting 3 treatment recommendations, unnecessary hospitalizations and nursing home placements, and adverse drug reactions. 4 5 addition to these problems, there are also issues regarding the 6 patient's ability to access a primary care physician, inadequate 7 physician payment, use of unnecessarily expensive medical 8 services, and poor care management for patients with chronic 9 health conditions. The legislature also finds that the concept 10 of the "medical home" provides a helpful approach to addressing 11 these problems. 12 The purpose of this Act is to define and establish 13 "patient-centered medical homes"; encourage licensed health care 14 providers and patients to partner in the patient-centered
- 15 medical home; define quality standards that will reduce
- 16 disparities in health care access, delivery, and health care
- 17 outcomes; and improve the overall quality of health care and
- 18 lower the costs therein.



1	SECTION 2. The Hawall Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	PATIENT-CENTERED MEDICAL HOME ACT
6	§ -1 Declaration of Purpose. The purpose of this
7	chapter is to encourage licensed health care providers and
8	patients to partner in patient-centered medical homes; define
9	and encourage adherence to quality standards that will reduce
10	disparities in health care access, delivery, and outcomes; and
11	improve the quality and lower the cost of health care.
12	§ -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
13	context clearly requires otherwise:
14	"Patient-centered medical home" means a health care
15	delivery model in which:
16	(1) Individual patients have an ongoing relationship with
17	a physician or other licensed health care provider
18	acting within the provider's scope of practice, who is
19	trained to provide first contact and continuous and
20	comprehensive care, or if appropriate, provide
21	referrals to health care professionals that provide
22	continuous and comprehensive care;

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1	(2)	A team of individuals at the practice level
2		collectively take responsibility for the ongoing
3		health care of patients by providing for all of a
4		patient's health care needs or appropriately making
5		referrals or arrangements for health care by other
6		qualified health care professionals; and
7	(3)	Care is coordinated and integrated across all elements
8		of the complex health care system, including mental
9		health and substance use disorder care, and the
10		patient's community, and care is facilitated, if
11		available, by registries, information technology,
12		health information exchanges, and other means to
13		ensure that patients receive the indicated care when
14		and where they need and want the care in a culturally
15		and linguistically appropriate manner.
16	\$	-3 Patient-centered medical home; duties. The
17	patient-c	entered medical home shall:
18	(1)	Advocate for its patients;
19	(2)	Utilize evidence-based medicine and clinical decision
20		support tools to guide decision making;

(3) Utilize licensed health care providers who accept

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1		through voluntary engagement in performance
2		measurement;
3	(4)	Seek patients' feedback and encourage active
4		participation in decision making to ensure that the
5		patients' expectations are being met;
6	(5)	Utilize information technology appropriately;
7	(6)	Participate in a voluntary recognition process
8		conducted by an appropriate nongovernmental entity to
9		demonstrate that the practice has the capabilities to
10		provide patient-centered services consistent with the
11		medical home model;
12	(7)	Allow patients and families to participate in quality
13		improvement activities at the practice level; and
14	(8)	Provide enhanced access to health care through systems
15		such as open scheduling, expanded hours, and new
16		options for communication between the patient, the
17		patient's personal provider, and practice staff.
18	\$	-4 Limitations. This chapter shall in no way be
19	construed	to:
20	(1)	Permit a medical home to engage in or otherwise aid
21		and abet in the unlicensed practice of medicine,
22		either directly or indirectly;

1	(2)	Change the scope of practice of physicians and
2		surgeons, nurse practitioners, or other health care
3		providers;
4	(3)	Affect the ability of a nurse to operate under
5		standard procedures pursuant to chapter 457;
6	(4)	Apply to activities of managed care plans, or their
7		contracting providers, or county alternative models of
8		care, or their contracting providers, or local
9		coverage expansion and enrollment demonstration
10		projects, if those activities are part of established
11		demonstration projects, as specified; or
12	(5)	Prevent or limit participation in activities
13		authorized by sections 2703, 3024, and 3502 of the
14		federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act
15		(Public Law 111-148), as amended by the federal Health
16		Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010 (Public
17		Law 111-152), if the participation is consistent with
18		state law pertaining to the scope of practice."
19	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
21	much there	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for
22	qualified	patient-centered medical homes as certified by the

- 1 office of the governor's healthcare transformation coordinator
- 2 or leadership team.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of the
- governor for the purposes of this Act. 4
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.

Description:
