A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PATIENT-CENTERED MEDICAL HOMES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that uncoordinated health 2 care results in duplicative procedures, conflicting treatment 3 recommendations, unnecessary hospitalizations and nursing home 4 placements, and adverse drug reactions. There are also issues 5 regarding the patient's access to a primary care physician, 6 inadequate physician payment, use of unnecessarily expensive 7 medical services, and poor care management for patients with 8 chronic health conditions. The legislature also finds that the 9 concept of the "medical home" or "health home" provides a 10 helpful approach to address these problems. 11 The purpose of this Act is to establish the med-QUEST 12 patient-centered medical home initiative, identify 13 responsibilities for the coordination and evaluation of the 14 patient-centered medical home model to be undertaken by the healthcare transformation coordinator, and appropriate funds for 15 16 these purposes.
- 17 SECTION 2. The department of human services shall prepare
 18 a medicaid state plan amendment to participate in the United
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- 1 States Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services patient-
- 2 centered medical home initiative under the health home provision
- 3 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (section
- 4 2703(a), P.L. 111-148), which provides an opportunity to build a
- 5 patient-centered system of care that achieves improved outcomes
- 6 for patients and better services for enrollees in state medicaid
- 7 programs. Under the health home provision, the federal medical
- 8 assistance percentage for health home services shall be ninety
- 9 per cent for the first eight fiscal year quarters that a
- 10 medicaid state plan amendment is in effect.
- 11 SECTION 3. The healthcare transformation coordinator and
- 12 staff shall develop a process to coordinate the med-QUEST
- 13 patient-centered medical home initiative and the medical home
- 14 efforts of private health insurance plans in the State, and
- 15 develop and harmonize defined measures to report and evaluate
- 16 outcomes in terms of quality and costs across the State. The
- 17 healthcare transformation coordinator shall consult with
- 18 patients, providers, and health plans, with the assistance of
- 19 national experts and agencies that certify patient-centered
- 20 medical homes, to:
- 21 (1) Establish standardized outcome measures to report and
- 22 evaluate improvements in health status and health

1		care, patient satisfaction, access, and cost-
2		effectiveness;
3	(2)	Identify and promote best practices in patient-
4		centered medical home workforce structures;
5	(3)	Incorporate patient-centered medical homes as an
6		essential element in care transitions and
7		accountability across the continuum of care; and
8	(4)	Develop payment strategies to sustain patient-centered
9		medical homes that improve health and health care and
10		reduce costs.
11	SECT	ION 4. Within three months of implementing the med-
12	QUEST patient-centered medical home initiative, the department	
13	of human services shall present an overview of the program's	
14	design to the legislature, and the healthcare transformation	
15	coordinator shall present a preliminary report to the	
16	legislature on the activities required by the healthcare	
17	transformation coordinator under section 3 of this Act.	
18	Following completion of an evaluation of the two-year health	
19	home provision, the healthcare transformation coordinator shall	
20	present the findings within the context of an updated report on	
21	the activities described in section 3 of this Act.	

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- 1 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the
- 4 department of human services to implement a patient-centered
- 5 medical home pilot with federal matching funds.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 7 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 to
- 11 support the position of the healthcare transformation
- 12 coordinator and staff in the office of the governor.
- 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of the
- 14 governor for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
