BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 11-302, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

- 6 (2) For the office of lieutenant governor \$1.40;
- 7 (3) For the office of mayor \$2.00;

- 11 (5) For all other offices 20 cents."

- 19 SECTION 7. Act 244, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, section
- 20 12, is amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 21 "(d) For general elections subject to this part, the base
- 22 amount of public funding shall be the average of the amount

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- 1 spent by the winning candidates in the previous two county
- 2 council general elections for [the same district,] all districts
- 3 in which a general election was held, reduced by ten per cent."
- 4 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 7 provided that section 6 of this Act shall take effect on January
- 8 1, 2013.
