A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 712, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§712- Maintaining a property nuisance. (1) A person
5	commits the offense of maintaining a property nuisance by
6	owning, leasing, occupying, or having charge or possession of
7	any residential property and maintaining that property in such a
8	manner that any one or more of the following conditions or
9	activities is allowed to exist or continue:
10	(a) Keeping, storing, depositing, or accumulating on
11	improved or unimproved real property any personal
12	property that is within the view of persons on
13	adjacent or nearby real property or public highway
14	when the personal property constitutes visual blight.
15	Personal property includes:
16	(i) Abandoned, wrecked, or dismantled motor vehicles
17	or boats or vessels;

1	<u>(ii)</u>	Automotive parts and equipment, appliances, and
2		<pre>furniture;</pre>
3	<u>(iii)</u>	Containers, packing materials, scrap metal, wood,
4		building materials, concrete masonry units,
5		litter, garbage, junk, rubbish, and debris;
6		provided that wood and building materials being
7		used, or to be used, for a project of repair or
8		renovation and for which an active building
9		permit is in effect may be stored for as long as
10		is necessary to complete the project
11		expeditiously. Upon expiration or cancellation
12		of the building permit, wood and building
13		materials for the project shall be immediately
14		removed; and
15	<u>(iv)</u>	Any photograph, drawing, sculpture, or similar
16		visual representation of any person of the age of
17		puberty or older that constitutes an offense of
18		displaying indecent matter under section 712-
19		<u>1211;</u>
20	(b) Keep	ing, storing, depositing, or accumulating dirt,
21	sand	, gravel, concrete, or other similar materials
22	that	constitute visual blight;

1	<u>(c)</u>	Operating a junk yard or automobile dismantling yard,	
2		except as a permitted use in an industrial zone;	
3	<u>(d)</u>	Permitting standing or stagnant water to accumulate,	
4		allowing vermin and insects to live, breed, and	
5		multiply;	
6	<u>(e)</u>	Creating, permitting, or maintaining any dangerous,	
7		unsightly, or blighted condition that constitutes	
8		visual blight;	
9	<u>(f)</u>	Attracting and providing a place of temporary abode	
10		for vagrants, interlopers, or trespassers; and	
11	<u>(g)</u>	Creating, permitting, or maintaining any condition	
12		recognized in law or in equity as constituting a	
13		public nuisance.	
14	(2)	Maintaining a property nuisance is a misdemeanor.	
15	(3)	For purposes of this section, "visual blight" means	
16	any unreasonable or unlawful condition, or use of premises or of		
17	a building exterior or interior that by reason of its appearance		
18	as viewed at ground level from the public right-of-way or from		
19	the neighboring premises, is detrimental to the surrounding		
20	areas and the property of others, or is detrimental to the		
21	health, safety, and welfare of individuals residing within that		
22	community."
