RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to continue to

 - (e) The department of business, economic development, and tourism may contract with the University of Hawaii for any services to support the work of the Hawaii [economic development task force.] food and energy security council.
- (f) The Hawaii [economic development task force] food and energy security council shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the

- 1 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 2 the regular session of 2011.
- 3 The [task-force] council shall also submit [a] annual
- 4 follow-up [reports] reports to the legislature no later than
- 5 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular [session]
- 6 sessions of 2012[-], 2013, and 2014. [The] Each report shall
- 7 include a description of the activities funded by the
- 8 environmental response, energy, and food security tax, progress
- 9 made toward energy and food self-sufficiency, and any additional
- 10 action necessary to achieve energy and food self-sufficiency.

- 12 energy security council shall cease to exist on June 30, [2012.]
