- 1 SECTION 1. Section 286-106.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:

- 5 (a) Notwithstanding section 286-106, the expired driver's
- 6 license of a member of any component of the United States armed

- 8 dependent if the dependent accompanied the member, and whose
- 9 driver's license expired while the member was deployed outside
- $10\,$ the United States, shall remain valid for ninety days after the
- 11 service member's return to the United States.
- 12 (b) After the ninety day period set forth in subsection
- (a), any member of the United States armed forces who is on
- 14 active federal service and stationed in Hawaii, or the member's
- 15 dependent if the dependent accompanied the member, and whose
- 16 driver's license expired while the member was deployed outside
- 17 the United States, may use a valid Status of Forces Agreement
