RELATING TO COMPUTER FRAUD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 3 Computer fraud in the third degree. (1) A 4 5 person commits the offense of computer fraud in the third degree 6 if the person knowingly, and with intent to defraud, accesses a 7 computer, computer system, or computer network with the intent to commit the offense of theft in the third or fourth degree. 8 9 (2) Computer fraud in the third degree is a class C 10 felony." SECTION 2. Section 708-891, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "[+]§708-891[+] Computer fraud in the first degree. (1)A person commits the offense of computer fraud in the first 14 15 degree if the person knowingly, and with intent to defraud, 16 accesses a computer [without authorization and, by means of such

conduct, obtains or exerts control over the property of another.

Amends sections 708-891 and 708-891.5, HRS, to include computer fraud that occurs when accessing a computer system or computer network. Makes computer fraud in the first degree a class A felony. Makes computer fraud in the second degree a class B felony.
