BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1	. Section 302B-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by ame	nding subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a) Cha	rter schools shall be exempt from chapters 91 and
4	92 and all other state laws in conflict with this chapter,	
5	except those regarding:	
6	(1) Coll	ective bargaining under chapter 89; provided that:
7	(A)	The exclusive representatives as defined in
8		chapter 89 and the local school board of the
9		charter school may enter into either supplemental
10		agreements that contain cost and noncost items to
11		facilitate decentralized decision-making[+] or
12		master agreements separate from any other master
13		agreement collectively bargained for between the
14		exclusive representatives and department, as
15		defined in chapter 89;
16	(B)	The agreements shall be funded from the current
17		allocation or other sources of revenue received
18		by the charter school; provided that collective

bargaining increases for employees shall be
allocated by the department of budget and finance
to the charter school administrative office for
distribution to charter schools; and
(C) These supplemental agreements and master
agreements may differ from the master contracts
negotiated with the department;
(2) Discriminatory practices under section 378-2; and
(3) Health and safety requirements."
SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
